Aly Sentenced to Four Life Terms

HALIFAX - Mohamed Aly plead guilty last week and was sentenced to four consecutive life terms for the first-degree murders of Joel Bianda and Ayanna Maertens Griffin and carjacking, in the Halifax Circuit Court. He was sentenced to an additional 18 years for related firearms offenses.

Southside Va. COVID Cases Continue to Rise as Vaccines Start to Arrive

SOUTHSIDE - Coronavirus vaccines are arriving across the United States, including in Virginia with healthcare workers among the first group of people to be offered the vaccine. More distribution is expected in the next several months, but for now the total number of positive cases continues on an upward trend even as new restrictions have been announced.

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) reported 306,848 total positive coronavirus tests during the pan-demic throughout the state on Monday, which is an increase of over 20,000. The total number of deaths in Virginia sits at 4,650 and increased by over 200 for the second straight week. There have been 16,878 hospitalizations now recorded since the pandemic began.







As they were both slumped over, the car was still moving. Aly had to reach forward into the front seat to try to stop it. He opened the back left passenger door and tried to stop it with his foot. Ultimately, he was able to put the car in park in the median on Highway 58 near Melon Road. He unfastened their seatbelts and pulled Joel and Ayan-na out of the car; and leaving their bodies in the grassy median, he seized control of the vehicle and drove to Dan-

his home in Danville. Aly told police he remembered he had left the firearm at the scene, so he and M. B. returned. Aly took Joel's and Ayanna's cell phones (and ultimately dis-posed of them in two different locations), inspected and left Joel's wallet, found the gun, and again seized control of Joel's vehicle. of those people lied, the infection rate for mask wearers versus non-mask wearers would be 50 percent meaning you have exactly the same chance of contracting COVID with or without a mask.





I read with considerable amusement last week's letter by Donna Sawyer calling for "fixing" - code for "eliminating" - the Electoral College, although with that reading came the melancholy reflection that our government schools have instilled in some of us such a degree of ignorance and lust for

Firstly, Beijing Biden and Heels-Up Harris did NOT win the popular vote. As your mother told you long ago, if you win by cheating, you didn't win. Barbara Rose Johns Statue to Replace Robert E. Lee at Capitol

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Virginia's statue of Confederate general Robert E. Lee was removed from the United States Capitol recently and it will be replaced by one of Barbara Johns who led a student walkout at Pobert Pussa Barbara Johns who led a student walkout at Robert Russa Moton High School in Farmville, protesting the overcrowded and inferior conditions of the all-Black school compared to those of White students at nearby Farmville High School High School.

Each state is entitled to display two statues in the National Statuary Hall Collection, and for 111 years, the Confederate statue has stood along with America's first president George Washington as Virginia's contributions. The two statues were added in 1909, which was 44 years after the Confederacy rebelled against the United States and was defeated. The Lee statue had been one among 13 locatad in the Crimt of the Capital ed in the Crypt of the Capitol, representing the 13 original colonies.

"We should all be proud of this important step forward for our Commonwealth and our country," said Governor Northam. "The Confederacy is a symbol of Virginia's racist and divisive history, and it is past time we tell our story with images of perseverance, diversity, and inclusion. I look forward to seeing a trailblazing young woman of color represent Virginia in the U.S. Capitol, where visitors will learn about Barbara Johns' contributions to America and 'We should all be proud of contributions to America and

contributions to America and be empowered to create positive change in their communities just like she did."

Earlier this year, Governor Northam signed legislation establishing the Commission for Historical Statues in the United States Capitol charged with studying the removal and replacement of the Robert E. Lee statue. The eight-member commission, eight-member commission, chaired by State Senator Lou-ise Lucas, voted unanimously

high-risk, front-line medical workers following the same protocols on a tiered basis.

After that, the distribution phases are flexible as we get a better understanding of availability and continue to learn more about the new vaccines. Our plan will include distributing the vaccine to an expanded pool of VCU Health employees, patients broader community.

Though exact timing is uncertain, we will always make decisions with the safety of our team members, patients and the community in mind.

How will we store the vaccines?

VCU Medical Center VCU Health's downtown Richmond hospital — meets all of the requirements to safely receive, store and transport the

COVID-19 vaccine.

The Pfizer vaccine must be stored in extremely cold temperatures. It can be stored up to six months in special ultra-low temperature freezers set to -80 degrees C. The Moderna vaccine - which is currently under consideration for emergency use by the FDA – can be stored up to six months in a standard freezer that maintains a temperature

of -20 degrees C.

As an academic medical center, VCU Health already has a number of these ultra-cold freezers, as well as the freezers and refrigerators necessary to store chemical medications and sensitive vaccines. We also have a new freezer to create extra storage space to ensure we are as prepared as possible to distribute the COVID-19 vaccine to whomever needs it.

How much vaccine will

VCU Health receive?
The state of Virginia is receiving an estimated 480,000 doses of vaccine for health care personnel and long-term care residents. We are working closely with the Virginia Department of Health, and expect to receive approximately 3,800 doses for initial distribution across the VCU Health System.



on July 24, 2020 to recommend removal of the statue. At the request of the Commission, the Virginia Museum of History and Culture in Richmond, Virginia will accept ownership of the statue.

"Confederate images do not represent who we are in Virginia, that's why we voted unanimously to remove this statue," said Senator Louise Lucas. "I am thrilled that this day has finally arrived, and I thank Governor Northam and the Commission for their and the Commission for their transformative work.'

On December 16, 2020, the Commission selected civil rights icon Barbara Rose Johns to replace the Robert E. Lee statue, after receiving public input from Virginia residents during several virtual public hearings. In 1951, sixteen-year-old Barbara Johns led a student walkout at Robert Russa Moton High

School in Farmville, protesting the overcrowded and inferior conditions of the all-Black school compared to those of White students at nearby Farmville High School. This garnered the support of NAACP lawyers Spottswood Robinson and Oliver Hill who took up her cause and filed a lawsuit that would later become one of five cases re-viewed by the United States Supreme Court in Brown v. Board of Education of Tope-ka when it declared segregation unconstitutional in 1954. Historians consider Johns' protest a pivotal moment that launched the desegregation

movement in America.

"As of this morning, Virginia will no longer honor the Confederacy in the halls of the United States Capitol," said Delegate Jeion Ward, who sponsored legislation creat-ing the Commission. "When I think of Barbara Johns, I am reminded of how brave she was at such a young age. It's time for us to start singing the songs of some of the Virginians who have done great things that have gone unnoticed. This is a proud moment for our Commonwealth, and I am humbled to have been a

part of it."

The General Assembly must approve the replacement before a sculptor can be commissioned. If approved, Johns would complement the statue of Washington, and would be the only teenager represented in the collection. Governor Northam has introduced a budget that includes \$500,000 to replace the stat-




where along the way, we've evolved from a celebration of the King of Kings' birth to a commercial season of chaos and stress.

The shepherds' visit and the startling confirmation that the manger was not an impulsive, embarrassing detail but rather a sign, a confirmation to the world that her child indeed was the son of

to the world that her child indeed was the son of God must have encouraged her, but there was still so much more she couldn't have known.

That Bethlehem night, as Mary delivered the Son of God in a stable in the piercing cold and placed him in a manger, she couldn't have fully grasped what God was doing. It was only in looking back that she could see how God was moving in her life and how every detail was significant.

And so it is for us. We are all in the middle of the stories God is writing. Perhaps we've received

Perhaps we've received a significant word from God but it is interwoven with unspeakably hard circumstances that leave us screaming, "It's not supposed to be this way!" We may be left confused and bewildered, wondering what God is doing and how this could possibly end well.






County Officials Approve Hazard Pay Bonuses
