South Florida murder suspect caught in LO

Jackson wanted for Oct. 17 shooting over cell phone.

LIVE OAK — A Live Oak man was captured Tuesday for a murder in West Palm Beach.

Investigators with the Suwannee County Sheriff's Office helped the United States Marshals Office with apprehending 37-yearold Joetavius Jackson on Tuesday after the Marshals tracked him to Live Oak. He was captured walking on West Duval Street near Shelby Avenue and was taken into custody without incident, according to an SCSO release.

Jackson is wanted in Palm Beach County for shooting and killing someone on Oct. 17 during an altercation over a cell phone.

Jackson was released from state prison in May following a 10-year sentence for the sale of cocaine in Suwannee County. Jackson has also served time in state prison for armed burglary and robbery and attempted robbery without a firearm in Palm Beach County.

MAYO — The Lafayette County Courthouse needs some repairs before it can get a new shine.

During a workshop Tuesday morning, the County Commission planned to discuss the lone bid it had received to pressure wash and paint the courthouse. That bid, from Lake City's Pro Tech Coatings Specialists, was opened at its Nov. 14 meeting and came in much higher than anticipated at a total of \$111,470.

Ukraine's capital flips to survival mode

Residents of Ukraine's bombed capital clutched empty bottles in search of water and crowded into cafés for power and warmth Thursday, switching defiantly into survival mode after new Russian missile strikes a day earlier plunged the city and much of the country into the dark.

In scenes hard to believe in a sophisticated city of 3 million, some Kyiv residents resorted to collecting rainwater from drainpipes, as repair teams labored to reconnect supplies. Friends and family members exchanged messages

to find out who had electricity and water back. Some had one but not the other. The previous day's aerial onslaught on Ukraine's power grid left many with neither. Cafés in Kyiv that by some small miracle had both





Jesus Christ is King of the Universe

ast Sunday, Catholics celebrated Jesus Christ as King of the Universe. But, as earthly creatures, we often have a difficult time putting our heads around Christ as king. We do not understand the kingdom, so we do not understand the

Matthew uses "kingdom of God" only a handful of times, but Luke and Mark use the term far more often. Matthew prefers to use the phrase "kingdom of heaven." Most scholars believe that they mean the same thing. And many believe that Matthew minimizes using "kingdom of God" because of a hesitation to use "God" for a Iewish audience.

The kingdom starts small. Jesus tells us that it is like a mustard seed (Mt 13:31-32, Mk 4:30-32; Lk 13:18-19). And yet it grows to a large bush.

The kingdom of God does indeed start small. It comes into the world through the Incarnation. It starts small in our eyes because it begins with the seemingly insignificant birth of what is understood

And yet, this child is a king. With an army more powerful than that of Caesar Augustus. Luke 2:13 tells us of the multitude of the heavenly host who appeared to the shepherds. The word "host" is our translation of a Greek word meaning "army." And it dwarfs anything that Caesar Augustus could

The magi traveled to see him in what we celebrate as "The Epiphany of the Lord." They recognized him as king with their gift of gold. They recognized him as priest with their gift of frankincense. They also recognized that he had to die in his mission by their gift of myrrh, a burial

The Gospel reading for our celebration of Christ the King is the exchange between Iesus and the "good thief" on the cross. Tradition tells us that this other man was named Dismas. And we honor him as Saint Dismas now. Dismas tells Jesus, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And Jesus responds, "Amen, I say to you, today vou will be with me in Paradise."

Our human eyes see a failed prophet sentenced to die a humiliating and horribly painful death by crucifixion.

Through the eyes of faith, we recognize that the

crucifixion is not a failure. Instead, it is a successful part of Jesus' mission. Through his death, he redeems the world. By his Resurrection, he opens the gates of heaven to us. At his Ascension, he goes to the right hand of the

Knowing that he is king, we know that all else is subject to him. Even death. It helps us to avoid fear of evil. Nothing evil can happen unless God permits it for a greater good. And Jesus as king can help us to avoid fear of death because he conquered death itself in the Resurrection. An event that opens the way for us too.

His kingdom may not be fully visible to us now, but it will become fully visible at the end of time.

Church. Biblical names are popular church names. Calvary Baptist Church, Bethany Baptist Church, and Damascus Baptist Church. Some church names indicate their prominence or location in a city. First, Central, Second, Northside, Eastside, Southside, Westside, or Main Street.

While traveling on a backroad in South Carolina, we saw some churches that have intriguing names. Ole Country Church, Soul's Harbor Baptist Church. I wonder if some church names are accurate reflections of the membership such as Unity Church, Friendship Baptist Church, and Fellowship Baptist Church. Some years ago, I saw a church sign that struck me as curious and is possibly the most intriguing church sign I've ever seen. Decoy Baptist Church. The definition of the word decoy is: (a) someone or something used to lure or lead another into a trap, (b) an artificial bird used to attract live birds within shot, (c) someone or something used to draw attention away from another. It would be interesting to know the origin of that church name.

Some church names seem to offer hope to those seeking spiritual direction and meaning in life such as Soul's Harbor Baptist Church near Westminster, S.C. Other names suggest inclusiveness such as Cathedral of All Souls in Asheville, N.C.

The three "lost" parables tell us how God sees us and what we mean to him. A lost sheep has lost its usefulness to the shepherd. A coin has no value to the owner while it is lost. The lost son had no fellowship with his father. When a lost person is saved, they have usefulness value and fellowship with God. The great desire of God's heart is to save those who are spiritually lost and restore them to a rightful relationship with Him. That was the main reason Jesus came to this earth. Luke 19 records the story of Zacchaeus who was lost until his encounter with Jesus. Jesus summarized that encounter with the words. "Today salvation has come to this house...for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Vs. 9-10).

Regardless of the name on a church sign, every church should be a "Church of the Lost and Found" because the main purpose of the church is to share the gospel with lost people and give them the opportunity to accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. People are spiritually lost. They need to be found.

Clinging to the Bible

he poet, in the fourth LIVING GOD'S WAY stanza of Psalm 119 (verses 25-32), expresses his frustrations about his life. However, he believes the word of God will revive him, and so, he will cling to the Bible.

He expresses two different emotions about something in his life. He says he "cleaves to the dust" (verse 25) and his "soul weeps because of grief" (verse 28). Something in his life may have brought him to some low point, or something has happened to bring about deep sorrow or sadness in his life. On the other hand. these expressions may refer to different emotions for the same event.

In either case, he says God's word, statutes, wonders, testimonies, ordinances, and commandments will do great things for him. They will revive him, strengthen him, and he will "run the way" God would have him live his life.

He says, "I have told of my ways, and You have answered me; teach me Your statutes" (verse 26). This indicates the writer was praying to God about his situation and God provided an answer to his circumstances through the things He has said. We might say God provided the answers when the man consulted the Bible.

work in which to look at the situation. The Bible can give recommendations as to how to handle certain difficult situations. The Bible can give us God's perspective on any situation which will provide us with correct, righteous wisdom concerning the situation.

However, just reading the Bible will only provide an attitude towards those things which bring about grief in our lives. The psalmist points out that he has "chosen the faithful way," he has "placed (God's) ordinances before" him, he will "cling to (God's) testimonies, and he will "run the way of (God's) commandments."

By doing all of these things, God will be the reason for him having an "enlarged heart." This is not a medical condition, but rather God's word has made

room in his heart for him to be glad, to no longer be frustrated with or grieving about something difficult or frustrating in his life.

The Bible is something every Christian should be cleaving to, holding on to tightly. It should be ever present in the Christian's life. On a daily basis, it should be consulted and applied, especially when hard times or frustrating circumstances happen in our life.

By following the actions and attitudes of this psalmist and by meditating, understanding and practicing God's precepts, Christians will be revived. By clinging to the Bible, Christians will be living God's way.

If we are honest with ourselves, we have reason to give thanks to the Lord for disciplining us as his children when we have been unfaithful to him. If the Lord doesn't discipline us when we sin, as we claim to be his then we are telling ourselves a lie. It's often during those times of being disciplined by the Lord that we learn to give thanks to him for his deliverance not just from our sins but through other situations as well.

Red tape to blame for difficulty to build

President Joe Biden says the Inflation Reduction Act, which contains some \$370 billion in climate spending, represents the most sweeping government investment in clean energy "ever, ever, ever." To ensure that investment is worthwhile, he'll need an equally unprecedented overhaul of federal rules and regulations. Congress should make such reforms a top priority.

Building anything in the U.S. requires navigating a rainforest of red tape. A primary impediment is the National Environmental Policy Act, which requires federally funded projects to undergo a laborious environmental-review process. Mandated impact studies can run for hundreds of pages, cost millions of dollars and take years to complete. Faced with such costly busywork, many projects don't get off the ground at all. Others endure seemingly endless legal challenges.

Green-energy projects have been no exception. Wind, hydropower, geothermal, solar, nuclear: However desirable such endeavors may be — even to the government itself — they're no match for the sheer obstructive power of state and federal rulebooks. Permitting now takes nearly three years on average for renewables projects, while preparation time for impact statements rose by more than 50% between 2000 and 2018.

Without change, this system could well thwart Biden's climate goals. By one estimate, the funding in the IRA and last year's infrastructure bill should be enough to reduce U.S. emissions to 42% below 2005 levels, near the president's goal of a 50% reduction by 2030. Yet green-ergy companies argue — persuasively — that these objectives aren't possible without permitting reform. As just one example: High-voltage transmission capacity will need to increase by about 60% by 2030. Under current rules, such a build-out could easily take twice that long.

Give credit to West Virginia Sen. Joe Manchin, then, for making permitting reform a priority. Last summer, as haggling over the IRA intensified, Manchin offered Democratic leaders a deal: He'd vote for their big spending splurge in exchange for a pledge to revisit the permitting issue down the road.

Among other things, Manchin's plan would've imposed time limits on environmental assessments, established a list of projects of "strategic national importance" for priority review, and given the federal government more power over permitting transmission lines. After a showdown with Senate Republicans, the package quickly died.

Even so, both Biden and Republican leaders say a permitting-reform measure of some kind remains a priority. As a start, any such deal should scrap the idea of time limits; perversely, truncated reviews can actually lead

As a start, any such deal should scrap the idea of time limits; perversely, truncated reviews can actually lead to worse delays by encouraging more lawsuits. Instead, Congress should make it harder to tie up projects with dubious legal proceedings. In particular, it should shorten the statute of limitations for such suits, enhance the requirements for standing in litigation, and limit the ability of courts to issue injunctions on projects that have already undergone significant environmental review.

Next, a clean-energy economy will be heavily reliant on expanding transmission capacity. Yet new power lines are all too easily obstructed by parochial state and local interests. The best bet is for Congress to pass some version of the SITE Act, which would empower a single federal regulator to oversee big interstate transmission projects in the national interest.

Across federal agencies, finally, new efforts are needed to maximize exemptions, speed reviews and otherwise prioritize clean-energy projects, an undertaking that above all demands leadership. Elected officials are quick to call climate change an "existential threat." They should show a little more urgency.

ALTERNATIVE COULD BE CHAOS

Will Biden run again? Should he?

President Joe Biden has been in an upbeat mood since the Democrats' best first-term midterm showing in 60 years — and no wonder.

For a second straight election, he achieved his presidency's overriding goal of protecting the nation's democratic institutions from the Trumpian threat. And the results relieved any immediate party pressure for him to forgo a 2024 re-election bid.

In fact, last weekend's USA TODAY/Ipsos poll showed the percentage of Democrats wanting Biden to run and believing he would win up about 10% since August, though half still opposed his re-election candidacy.

Still, as Biden quietly marked his 80th birthday last Sunday, the basic Democratic dilemma remained: Will it be best for the party — and the country — to renominate the nation's oldest president, even if the alternative is chaos?

Biden's best argument for running again is that, as in 2020, he feels able to do the job and may be the only Democrat who can beat Donald Trump. But though Trump still dominates the GOP, its unexpectedly poor 2022 showing has more Republicans saying openly that it is time to move on.

Midterm election exit polls showed a higher percentage of voters opposed another race by Trump than opposed a second term bid by Biden.


The prospect of a 2020 rerun against Trump apparently animates the president's thinking. "Don't compare me to the almighty, compare me to the alternative," he likes to say. Of course, with a burgeoning GOP field, almost every alternative is younger and possibly more electable than Trump.

On the other hand, just as
France's King Louis XV correctly
predicted more than two centuries ago that his departure would
prompt a "deluge," so too do the
Democrats face the possibility
that a post-Biden free-for-all could
undercut their hopes of retaining
the presidency

the presidency.

Both parties regard Vice
President Kamala Harris, the natural heir to Biden and almost certain to run if he bows out, as a weak candidate who would encounter difficulties in both a nominating race and the general election.

But potential rivals need to consider that opposing the first Black,

again be South Carolina, where the 2020 primary electorate was more than half Black.

And if Harris faces impediments, so do her potential rivals. For Minnesota Sen. Amy Klobuchar and Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo, it's the glass ceiling for women that contributed to Hillary Clinton's defeat. For Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg, it's being an openly gay man with a husband. For California Gov. Gavin Newsom, it's an image as a trendy California liberal. And for the best-known progressives, it's not only being too far left but too old (Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders), too young (New York Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez), too sharp-edged (Washington Rep. Pramila Jayapal) or too obscure (California Rep. Ro Khanna).

Though Biden would be 86 by the end of a second term, he still seems inclined to seek re-election, as has every modern president. But the nation's oldest president has left the door ajar, if his health deteriorates or he and his family decide it's time to end his half-century political career.

"Our intention is to run again," Biden told his Nov. 9 post-election news conference. But he said it was "ultimately, a family decision" that would be made sometime early next year, though he added, "I think everybody wants me to run."

Not everybody in the public. The Election Day exit polls showed a majority of independents and nearly half of all Democrats thought Biden should not run again.

But the pre-election expectation of post-election Democratic disarray focused on Biden's future didn't happen. Instead, Republicans are beset with internal strife after failing to meet their expectations of a "red wave" that would capture the House, the Senate and key governorships.

That disarray is providing the Democrats and Biden with a useful respite. If it persists, the House GOP focus on investigating instead of legislating may make him look good by contrast.

Still, many Democrats expect a Biden re-election candidacy would face opposition from the party's progressive wing, which opposed him in 2020 and has often pressured him to act more boldly. But its most prominent leader, Sanders, is even older than Biden.

Meanwhile, continued good health may be the best way for Biden to allay concerns about his age, along with occasional videos showing him riding his bike. Though he skipped a dinner at the end of one long day, Biden last week completed an arduous, weeklong round-the-world trip to conferences in Egypt, Cambodia and Indonesia that showed him on top of the issues and very much in command.

Still, signs of his age show in his often awkward gait, verbal stumbles and sometimes less-than-forceful public speaking. A re-election campaign would be challenging both politically and physically.

In 2020, the covid pandemic enabled Biden to avoid the usually hectic speaking schedule and campaign from his basement. That won't be possible in 2024.

As for a possible Trump rematch, Biden insists he feels no pressure for an early decision "no matter what…my predecessor does."

But the former president's prospects could ultimately affect Biden's decision if his principal motivation remains his belief he has the best chance of keeping the 45th president from becoming the 47th.

TALLAHASSEE — The transfer portal has been kind to Florida State coach Mike Norvell.

Florida's Billy Napier should hope for similar success when he dives in deep this offseason. The 16th-ranked Seminoles (8-3) are likely to

start seven transfers on offense when they host the rival Gators (6-5) on Friday night. The list includes dynamic quarterback Jordan Travis (Louisville), leading rusher Trey Benson (Oregon) and leading receiver Johnny Wilson (Arizona State).

The trio has been the backbone of a team that's scored at least 38 points in four straight victories, each by more than three touchdowns.

No one would be surprised to see them do the same to Florida, which is coming off a humbling loss at Vanderbilt and has been gouged for more than 400 yards in seven games already this season.

FSU is 9 1/2-point favorites, according to FanDuel Sportsbook. It's the largest point spread in favor of the Seminoles at home in the series since 2000. Getting to this point has been a credit to Norvell, who mined the portal for 35 guys in his first three seasons.

"If there's a right player that might have a little more experience or can come in and make that immediate impact, that still fits our locker room and

NFL Jags claim RB Henderson off waivers from Rams

JACKSONVILLE — Jacksonville claimed veteran running back Darrell Henderson off waivers from the Los Angeles Rams on Wednesday, giving the Jaguars more experience behind starter Travis Etienne.

Jacksonville waived offensive lineman John Miller to make room for Henderson on the 53-man roster.

Henderson rushed for 1,742 yards and 13 touchdowns over four seasons with the Rams, who chose him in the third round in 2019. Henderson started 28 games, including seven this season, and played extensively in the Los Angeles backfield whenever he was injury-free during his career.

Henderson played just four snaps in last week's loss at New Orleans. Rams coach Sean McVay said Henderson had a minor knee injury, citing it as the reason he barely played. But Henderson is in the final year of his rookie contract before free agency, and the Rams were moving on before the final seven games of what's looking like a lost season.

Henderson has 283 yards rushing and three touchdowns this season. He is averaging 4.0 yards a carry. He could end up replacing backup JaMycal Hasty,

who has 24 yards on 13 touches since Jacksonville traded James Robinson to the New York Jets in late



Clemson chasing history vs. rival South Carolina

lemson coach Dabo Swinney can't think of a better time to face rival South Carolina.

"They played their best game and we played our best game," Swinney said. "We're two good teams coming off big wins. Both teams have some confidence."

Swinney is glad that both teams are playing well heading into the weekend as No. 7 Clemson (10-1) hosts South Carolina (7-4) with a chance to set the all-time best win streak in a series first played in 1896.

The Tigers have won seven straight over the Gamecocks, matching Clemson's run of success from 1934-40 in the Palmetto State's top sporting rivalry.

But South Carolina comes in with some juice after its unexpected 63-38 demolition of then-No. 5 Tennessee last

week. "I love that they did that," Clemson tight end Jake Briningstool said. "Them coming in here hot, with a sense of ar-

rogance, is perfect for us." Gamecocks quarterback Spencer Rattler knows Clemson will be every bit the challenge Tennessee was and his team will have to have the same hard-working approach it took to beating the Vols if

they want to beat a second straight Top-10 opponent. "I know it's going to be a crazy environment." Rattler said. "We're just looking forward to the opportunity, coming off a good game, we want to have a great week of practice and focus on us.

It's all about us." That's not always easy to do. Among the congratulations he got were texts from ex-NFL players Terrell Owens and

MISSING BACKS

South Carolina pulled off its Tennessee win without its top two tailbacks in injured MarShawn Lloyd and Wake Forest grad transfer Christian Beal-Smith. Lloyd, who still leads the Gamecocks with 556 yards and nine touchdowns, has missed the past three games with a thigh bruise. Beal-Smith, with five rushing TDs, has been out the past two with a foot injury. Beamer said both participated in practice Tuesday.

WHAT'S NEXT

Rattler and Clemson quarterback DJ Uiagalelei both say they're focused on what's ahead this season instead of on the NFL. The two said this week they'll consider their future after the season.

DEAD-LEG DJ

Briningstool said players call their quarterback "Dead-leg DJ" for the way he carefully jukes defenders when he takes off on QB scrambles. Uiagalelei laughs at the nickname but has used that style effectively this season. He's gained 308 yards on 105 attempts with four touchdowns on the ground. Uiagalelei led the Tigers with 89 yards rushing in last week's win over Miami.

RIVALRY TALK

This is Swinney's favorite week of the season. The Alabama native and member of the 1992 Crimson Tide national championship team, Swinney loves the intensity that surrounds games like Auburn-Alabama and Clemson-South Carolina. "Northwestern and Indiana, they're probably not having marriages break up over that," Swinney said. "No offense to Northwestern and Indiana."

Alabama, Auburn play for bragging rights, bowls

labama can lock up another 10win season. Auburn is targeting bowl eligibility and a happy ending to a trying season.

But this Iron Bowl, more than most in recent memory, is primarily about the year's worth of braggin' rights that come with a win. Typically, that's enough.

The eighth-ranked Crimson Tide (9-2, 5-2 Southeastern Conference, No. 7 CFP) isn't playing to remain in the league title or playoff contention but could still perhaps enhance its bowl destination. That reality denies Auburn (5-6, 2-5) even the joys of playing the spoiler role but a bowl shot is still on the line.

It's still big, as Alabama coach Nick Saban said, "one of the greatest rivalry games in college football." Important to fans and players' legacies and offseason moods. It's just for statewide supremacy, not national title hopes like it has been for both programs multiple times since Saban's arrival.

"It means a lot to us, our players and our fans, and we're going to do the best job we can to get ready for this game," said Saban, whose teams have all reached 10 wins every season following his 2007 debut.

Auburn has staged a minor turnaround with back-to-back wins over Texas A&M and Western Kentucky under interim coach Carnell Williams. It would become a major one with an upset of the Tide, which is a threetouchdown favorite.

Williams, the hero of the 2003 Iron Bowl for Auburn, doesn't think he needs a "magical speech" to get his team up for this one. But he has had the Tigers playing better lately.

"I truly feel like a lot of stuff that's understood really doesn't need to be said," said Williams, a former Auburn and NFL

In a week filled with plenty of traditional rivals, the Iron Bowl stands out. There's no trip to the Southeastern Conference title game on the line, but there is plenty of drama for both teams. The Crimson Tide had only been outside the College Football Playoff once in its first six years until 2022. A loss in this one might drop Alabama outside the New Year's Six tier of bowls. Alabama's two losses have come by a total of four points. Alabama is led by Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Bryce Young, who has passed for 2,664 yards with 24 touchdowns and six interceptions. The Tigers almost did it again last season, falling 24-22 in a four-overtime game. Alabama survived and won the SEC title before falling in a national championship rematch with Georgia.

DETROIT — Tyler Bass made a tiebreaking 45-yard field goal with 2 seconds left, lifting the Buffalo Bills to a 28-25 win over the Detroit Lions on Thursday for their second victory in five days at Ford Field.

Josh Allen set up the game-winning kick by starting the drive with a 36-yard pass to Stefon Diggs and running twice for 12 yards.

Buffalo (8-3) has won two straight to move a half-game ahead of Miami in the AFC East.

Allen threw a go-ahead, 5-yard touchdown pass to Diggs with 2:40 left, but Bass missed the extra point to make it 25-22.

The Lions converted fourthand-1 from midfield with Amon-Ra St. Brown's 7-yard end-around to set up Michael Badgley's game-tying, 51-yard field goal with 23 seconds to go. Badgley missed a 29-yard field goal late in the third and Iared Goff took a sack for a safety in the same quarter and those mistakes proved to be costly.

Allen had a passing and rushing touchdown in the first half, finishing 24 of 42 for 253 yards to more than make up for throwing his 11th interception of the season.

Detroit (4-7) missed an opportunity to win four straight games for the first time since 2016 and

lost a franchise-record sixth straight game on Thanksgiving

ARLINGTON, Texas — Dak Prescott threw two touchdown passes to tight end Dalton Schultz, Ezekiel Elliott ran for a score and Dallas beat New York.

Rookie Peyton Hendershot ran for a 2-yard TD for Dallas. The victory ended a three-game losing streak on the holiday for the Cowboys (8-3), who moved a game ahead of the Giants in the NFC East while sweeping the season series.

Prescott's TD tosses to Schultz came about five minutes apart in the third quarter, turning a 13-7 deficit into a 21-13 lead.

what we're building, then obviously we will explore all those things," Norvell said.

Norvell's starting lineup is filled with transfers: three offensive linemen, the team's top two tacklers and its best pass rusher.

Napier used the portal sparingly in his first year, bringing running back Montrell Johnson and right guard O'Cyrus Torrence with him from Louisiana-Lafayette and adding Arizona State receiver Ricky Pearsall. All three have been integral additions. Johnson leads the team in rushing, Torrence is likely an All-Southeastern Conference selection and Pearsall leads the Gators with three TD catches.

Napier is expected to wade further into the portal pool in Year 2, especially since the Gators are losing nine scholarship players to graduation and already have seen another eight guys leave the program in the past month.

"I think it's a shame sometimes when they do it before the season's out," Napier said. "I don't necessarily think that's a positive. But it's the rules that we've been given, right? You can sit around and worry about that or you can just focus on the things you can control. ... I think we all understand it's happening everywhere."

HOBBLED GATORS

Florida will be without five receivers, including Anthony Richardson's top two targets. Napier ruled out leading receiver Xzavier Henderson and second-leading receiver Justin

Shorter along with backups Ja'Quavion Fraziars, Marcus Burke and Thai Chiaokhiao-Bowman on Wednesday.

Ricky Pearsall was listed as questionable, but Napier expects the Arizona State transfer to be cleared to play.

"We've been in this situation in the past," Napier said. "There's been parts of our team every week throughout the season where we've had a handful of guys banged up.

"It's a great opportunity for those players and we've got great stories from different times of the year. ... Next guy up and certainly excited to watch some of these guys play."

Caleb Douglas, Pearsall and Daejon Reynolds were listed as projected starters on Florida's weekly depth chart. Reynolds made the most of an increased role last week at Vanderbilt, finishing with eight catches for 165 yards and two touchdowns.

Reynolds has 11 catches for 244 yards on the season. Douglas has eight receptions for 150 yards and two scores. Pearsall has caught 24 passes for 448 yards and three TDs. But there's little, if any, depth behind them.

"There's no question they're very capable," Napier said. "The way we practice, all the players on our team get multiple opportunities throughout the OTAs in the summer, training camp, you know it helps you build depth on your team so you can survive some of these situations."

Henderson and Shorter have been Florida's big-play receivers all year. Henderson has 38 catches for 410 yards and two TDs. Shorter has 29 receptions for 577 yards and two scores. Florida does not disclose

the exact nature of injuries,

only saying upper or lower body. Henderson and Shorter both have lower-body injuries. Pearsall, Fraziars, Burke and Chiaokhiao-Bowman have upper-body issues.

Linebacker Ventrell Miller, the heart of the Gators' defense, also has to sit out the first half because of a targeting ejection against Vanderbilt. The Gators also could be without safety and leading tackler Rashad Torrence.

Miller's absence would be the biggest setback considering the Seminoles have run for at least 200 yards in six consecutive games — the longest active streak in the nation.

"It's going to be a big loss," Florida safety Trey Dean said. "But we're going to be all right, I promise you that."

NOVEMBER REIGN

FSU's Travis is completing 81.6% of his passes in three November games. He has 11 TD passes and just nine incompletions in wins over Miami, Syracuse and Louisiana-Lafayette. Travis has 21 TD passes, five rushing scores and a TD reception this season.

NOT SO SPECIAL

Florida is coming off its worst special-teams performance of the season. The Gators muffed a punt that led to a touchdown and missed an extra point in a seven-point loss at Vanderbilt.

Since returning a punt 48 yards to set up a score against Missouri in early October, Napier's team has done little to change games in that phase.





What to expect: This Region 1-2S final should be a much more competitive game than a year ago when Florida High poured it on in Suwannee's season finale during a driving rainstorm. The Seminoles, who were 8-1 after that win last year and advanced to a state semifinal before losing to Chaminade-Madonna, are once again elite. Florida High is the top-rated team in Class 2S and has an offense adept at beating teams through the air — quarterback Jeremy Johnson has thrown for more than 1,800 yards — and on the ground — running backs Micahi Danzy and Rhyder Poppell have combined for more than 1,900 yards rushing. The Seminoles' defense, while not as talented individually as West Florida or Bradford, plays great together and doesn't beat itself. Suwannee, winners of eight straight and looking for its first semifinal appearance since 2014, has been the same way during its winning streak. Richarlison's goals help Brazil beat Serbia

LUSAIL, Qatar — With Neymar limping off the field with an ankle injury, Richarlison came through for the "Seleção."

A spectacular acrobatic kick followed an easy tap-in from close range as Richarlison scored both goals in Brazil's 2-0 victory over Serbia on Thursday at the World Cup.

Brazil team doctor Rodrigo Lasmar said Neymar sprained his right ankle. He declined to speculate on whether he would be available to play in the team's next match against Switzerland on Monday.

In the 73rd minute, Richarlison used one touch to get the ball up in the air and then spun around and got off the ground before knocking the ball into the net with his right foot.

Brazil had struggled to get past the Serbian defense until Richarlison scored from close range in the 62nd in a buildup that started with Neymar.

Vinícius Júnior assisted on both goals.

PORTUGAL 3, GHANA 2 DOHA, Qatar —

DOHA, Qatar — Cristiano Ronaldo became the first male player to score at five World Cups with his 65th-minute penalty in a 3-2 win over Ghana on Thursday.

Andre Ayew equalized for Ghana eight minutes later, but Joao Felix regained the lead for Portugal in the 78th and Rafael Leao added a third. Osman Bukari reduced Ghana's deficit in the 89th.

The 37-year-old Ronaldo was looking to showcase his talents to potential new clubs after having his contract terminated at Manchester United this week. After wasting two good chances in the first half, he tumbled under a challenge by Ghana defender Mohammed Salisu to earn a penalty.

URUGUAY 0, SOUTH KOREA 0

AL RAYYAN, Qatar — South Korea and Uruguay started their World Cup campaigns with a 0-0 draw on Thursday, a result that probably favors the Asian team.

South Korea, with forward Son Heung-min wearing a mask to protect a broken left eye socket, always looked the more likely team to score against the more experienced Uruguayans. The South Koreans were quicker, pressing from the opening whistle.
