April

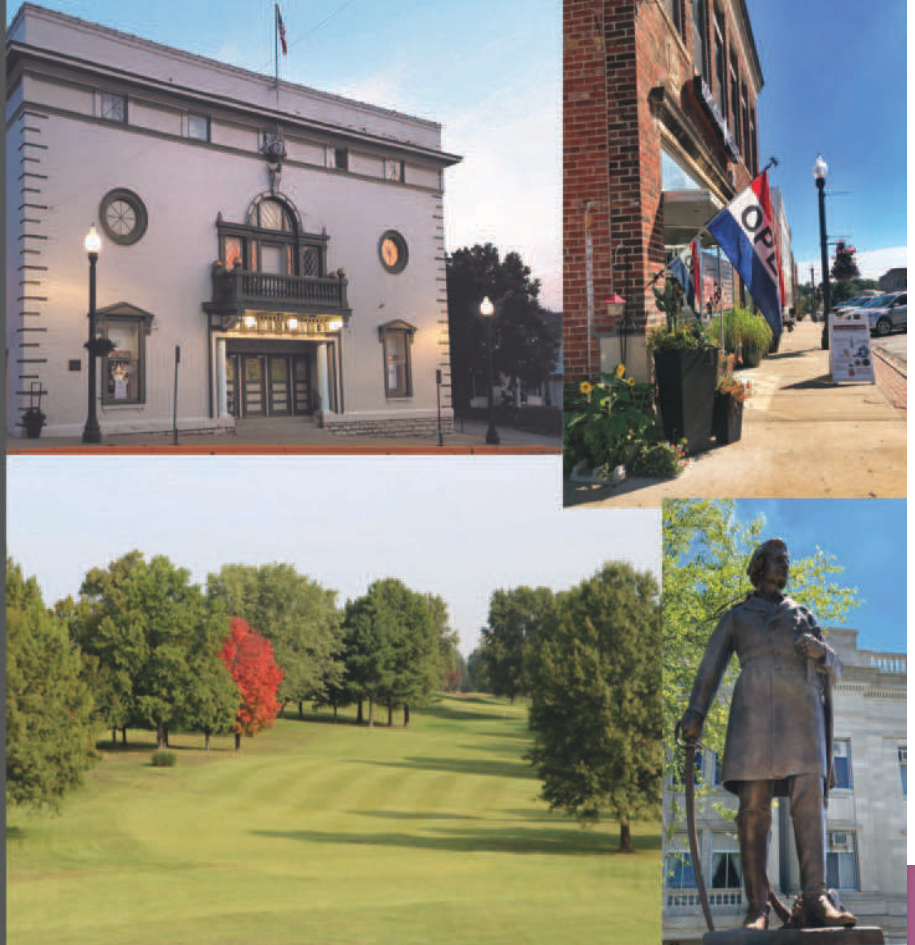

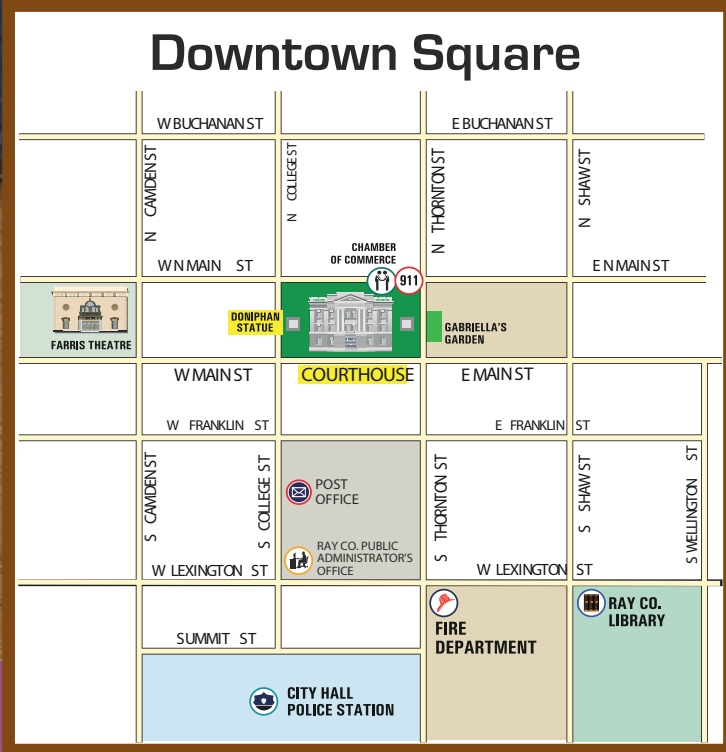

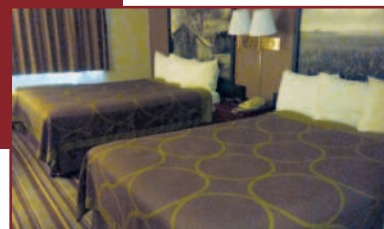

Explore the Outdoors



How to hike safely in remote areas

Many people have rediscovered the great outdoors in the wake of the COVID-19 outbreak. Social distancing measures have greatly restricted indoor gatherings, but outdoor activities, particularly once parks were reopened, have allowed people to get out of their homes while still keeping their distance from others.

Remote hiking trails provide perfect opportunities to experience the wonders of nature while social distancing, but it's imperative that hikers take certain precautionary measures on such excursions in order to stay safe.

- **Pack extra clothing:** Extra clothing is vital on a remote hiking excursion for a number of reasons. Some extra socks, a wind- and rain-resistant jacket and an extra pullover can help hikers stay warm and dry if the weather changes while they're hiking and trying to return to their vehicles. In addition, extra clothing can help hikers stay warm if they suffer an injury while hiking and need to camp overnight once the sun goes down.

- **Pack extra food:** Extra food and water is just as vital when hiking remote areas as extra clothing. Extra food can make emergency situations more manageable, helping people avoid hunger if they need to camp overnight or simply keep their energy up on long hikes. Trail mix tends to be high in calories and full of protein, making it an ideal, easily packed food

to bring along on a hiking trip.

- **Don't go it alone:** Solo hiking can be a great way to connect with nature, but it's always best to hike remote areas with at least one other person. Hiking in pairs ensures someone is there to seek help if a hiker is injured and rendered immobile while out on the trails.

- **Let others know your whereabouts:** If going on a solo hike or even with a partner, share your location and intended hiking route with a loved one who is not coming along for the hike. Let that person know when you intend to return and that you will call that person when you safely make it back to your vehicle. If the call never comes, your loved one can then alert the appropriate authorities and share detailed information about where you are hiking.

- **Bring maps:** Pack a road map showing the way to the trail and a map of the park itself. Remote areas might not have the best internet connections, rendering car GPS systems useless. And a printed map of the park can help hikers reduce their risk of getting lost once inside the park. Pick up or order a map of the park in the days prior to your trip. Don't wait until you arrive at the park to get a map, as the park might not have any on hand.

Hiking remote areas is an ideal activity in the age of social distancing. But safety must be a priority on such trips.

Conservation Sites

Blue Jay Trail Access

30 acres for birdwatching, plus fishing for catfish and sunfish in a stream. Most of the area is wooded.

From Lawson, take Route D east 2 miles, then Route C north 0.20 mile, then Route D east 3 miles and Coon Branch Road north 0.75 mile to the area.

Crooked River Conservation Area

In Rayville. The area includes 1,420 acres of forest/woodland, several small ponds and 3 miles of frontage on Crooked River. Wildlife that might be seen in the area includes deer, turkeys, quail, squirrels and songbirds.

From Richmond, take Highway 13 north 5 miles, then Route FF west 3 miles, then Wildlife Road north 1 mile to area entrance.

Foxglove Conservation Area

54 acres of native prairie and grasslands. The land was purchased in 1990 by the state conservation department from Claude H. and Marian E. Fine. The second largest population of auriculate false foxglove in the state is supported on these prairie lands found in the western section of the Glaciated Plains.

At Route M in Vibbard, take 160th Street east 1.10 miles, then Hidden Valley Road north 0.90 mile to the entrance.

Frank E. Wagner Conservation Area

Half-grassland and half-forest on 130 acres, it is a fine area for camping, hunting, trapping and birdwatching.

From Millville, take Route K northeast 2.50 miles, then Route E south 1 mile, then Conservation Road 1 mile to area entrance.

Hardin Conservation Area

238.5 acres for hunting turkeys or deer, fishing for catfish or crappie, waterfowl hunting and individual campsites for the outdoors person. Birds are always present for the birdwatcher.

From Hardin, take Route J south 0.75 mile to area entrance.

Lawson City Lake

On this 25-acre body of water, a fisherman can catch black bass, catfish, crappie and sunfish. Overlooking the Lawson City Lake is a brand new campground, Lakeview Campground and RV Park, which has 22 reservable, full-service sites with electric, water and sewer hookups.

Piggs Landing Access

9-acre area with a boat ramp to Fishing River where one can catch catfish when fishing. Area is partially wooded, so it makes a great place to watch birds.

From Orrick, take Highway 210 west 1 mile to the Fishing River.

Ray County Lake

A fisherman's dream, located just north of Richmond off state Highway 13, Ray County Lake is a 25-acre lake. Largemouth bass 16-18 inches are common, along with panfish, such as bluegill and crappie.

Ray County Lake is a beautiful spot to spread out a blanket and have a picnic or just enjoy nature.

The lake sits amidst 159.3 acres of land and water waiting to be enjoyed by birdwatchers, hikers and outdoorsmen.
