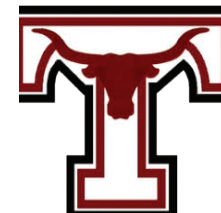

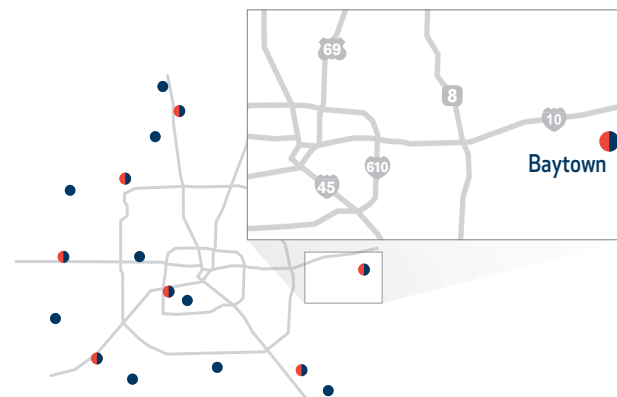

Indians' new head coach from Oconomowoc

Cleveland's new Athletic Director and Head Coach Jason Fiocco comes to Cleveland ISD from two years as AD/HC at Elkhart a 3A district school. He is a 2010 graduate of the University of Northern Iowa.

He spent a season as an assistant coach at Ellsworth Community College in Waterloo, then was 3 years at 4A La Vernia ISD in San Antonio as a coach and special education teacher. He went north for the 2015 season, teaching and coaching in Kalamazoo, Michigan, then headed back to Texas for 2 years



at Yoakum ISD, where he was the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator.

Yoakum is also a 3A division 1 school, and Cleveland is Fiocco's first coaching job at a 5A school, although Cleveland has not been 5A for long and is still

working out how to be a big school.

Before Northern Iowa, Fiocco committed to the Iowa State Cyclones, as a 6-1, 300-pound offensive lineman from Oconomowoc, Wisconsin, who had been a first team all state pick his senior year at Harland Arrowhead. He was assigned to the Cyclones scout team but quit the program before the season was over and left Iowa State at the end of his semester.

Fiocco transferred to the University of Northern Iowa where he played right guard for Panthers and also lifted weights. As a weightlifter, Fiocco went to the Pan American Games in 2006 and came home with a bronze medal.

Lufkin top of the class in District 8-5A DI

The Lufkin Panthers are the head of the District 8-5A DI class and everyone else will be shooting for them. The Panthers return 11 starters back including quarterback Jordan Moore who almost passed for 3,000 yards in 2019. College Station, New Caney, and both Magnolia scores should compete for the other three spots. You cannot overlook the Porter Spartans either.

CANEY CREEK PANTHERS — Starters Returning O/D: 5/7. 2019: 2-8/ 1-6 district. The Panthers do return 12 starters from a year ago and will be lead by TE/DE Edgar Heredia who led the team in receptions and sacks a year ago. The quarterback should be Rowdy Sebastian.

COLLEGE STATION COUGARS — Starters Returning O/D: 4/4. 2019: 8-4 area-finalist/ 5-2 district. Roderick Brown led the ground game a year ago with over 1,200 yards and 16 scores and should see plenty of carries again. The defense is led by LB Bubba Carter who finished with 120 tackles and 7 sacks.

LUFKIN PANTHERS — Starters Returning O/D: 6/5. 2019: 9-2 bi-district finalist/ 7-0 district. It all starts with quarterback Jordan Moore who amassed some big numbers in 2019. WR Kelton Wright finished with 700 yards and 6 touchdowns receiving will running back Caleb Berry finished with 864 yards and 13 touchdowns.

MAGNOLIA BULLDOGS — Starters Returning O/D: 5/8. 2019: 8-4 area finalist/ 5-2 district. The offense has a couple of big weapons returning in RB Mitch Hall (2,036 yards, 14 TDs rushing), and quarterback Travis Moore who passed for 1,839 yards and 25 touchdowns.

MAGNOLIA WEST MUSTANGS — Starters Returning O/D: 8/7. 2019: 5-6 bi-district finalist/ 4-3 district. The Mustangs are led by a pair of stand-out receivers in wide receivers Marcus Collins and Trey Leggett. A 1,000 yard rusher also returns in Hunter Bilbo.

NEW CANEY EAGLES — Starters Returning O/D: 4/8. 2019: 10-1 bi-district finalist/ 7-0 district. The Eagles have one of the best linebackers in the state in Texas commit Derrick Harris (89 tackles, 5 sacks). Cale Sanders rushed for over 1,000 yards and 16 touchdowns in 2019.

PORTER SPARTANS — Starters Returning O/D: 4/4. 2019: 9-3 area finalist/ 6-1 district. Back is quarterback Jace Russell to lead the offense while wide receiver Luke Cordle should be one of his favorite targets. The secondary is strong with returners Austin Perkins, Jaylynn Briley, and Cordle.

WALLER BULLDOGS — Starters Returning O/D: 4.3. 2019: 0-9/ 0-7 district. The Bulldogs have not had many winless seasons although last year was one of those. Caleb Godfrey passed for over 1,200 yards and nine touchdowns while RB Jared Hicks is a nice balance in the backfield running the football.

Ware ready to bring that Bronco tradition back

The Dayton Broncos had a string of 20 straight years to the playoff come to an end in 2016. Not making the post season for the last four years, Dayton went and found a new head coach in Blake Ware from New Caney.

Ware helped build the Eagles football program the last few years as the offensive coordinator and into a play-off regular.

"We turned New Caney into a special program," said Ware. "Dayton is a special place and has a lot of football tradition. We are going to bring all that

back."

Before the stop in New Caney, Ware was the head coach at St. Pius X.

"This was the perfect fit for me here in Dayton. The administration here is super and they have the same vision for the program that I do. Plus it's Dayton and they have a rich playoff tradition that we are going to bring back. We are going back to the white helmets and that Bronco is once again going to mean something. There is a lot of excitement around here. These kids have been working very hard."

Ware and his team finished up five weeks of conditioning on Aug. 13.

"It has been a constant state of im-



provement," said Ware. "The pieces are starting to fall into place."

On the offensive side of the ball it will be junior Blayne Denton at the quarterback position. At the running back slot it will be Daveon Washington and Anthony Robles. Perhaps the deepest position for the Broncos will be the receiver position in which Ware says he can go two deep for all four slots.

"I am very excited at the depth we have at receivers," added Ware.

Seeing time will be Donovan Orebo, Jaxon Purse, Ashton Garner, Davin Lee, Kody Arceneaux, and Zack Huntley. Up front on the line will be Landon Wood, Pierre Broussard, Logan Strong, Trey Rodgers, and Brennan Chauvin. The offensive coordinator is Philip Pendleton. Moving to the other side of the ball and defensive coordinator Freddie Strange will have up front Camron Cooper, Cam'Ron Willis, Tim Sjolander, Eugene Roy, Eric Rosales, and Isaiah Martin. The linebackers will be Matthew Drabbant and Esteban Vega. In the secondary for the Broncos it will be Austin Murphree, Connor Murphree, Kameron George, Victor Zuniga, Jairen Coronado, James Harris, Fernando Ortiz, and Lee.

"I am very excited about this group on defense," said Ware.

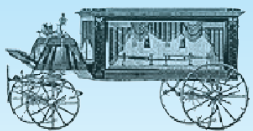
Handling the kicking duties for Day-

ton will be Gustavo Orozco. The Broncos will kick off the season on Thursday, Sept. 24 at Lake Creek. Dayton then has six of its final nine games of the season at home with Montgomery and Pasadena Memorial coming in after the opening Thursday night game. After an open week on Oct. 16, Crosby comes to town on Oct. 23 to start District 12-5A DII play. After an away game to Port Neches-Groves, the Santa Fe Indians come to visit for Homecoming. Thanksgiving week will see the Barbers Hill Eagles visiting Houston Methodist Field at Bronco Stadium on Nov. 27. The regular season finishes up at Kingwood Park on Dec. 4.

Balanced 12-5A DII should be a dog fight to the finish

In 2019, the Barbers Hill Eagles grabbed the district crown and made it to the third round of the playoffs. With the help of 13-starters back in Mont Belvieu there is no reason why the Eagles should not contest for another district title. Crosby had a nice run last year and most of the offense is back which could mean trouble for opposing defenses. PN-G, Nederland, Texas City, Kingwood Park, and Dayton with new Head Coach Blake Ware should battle for the final two spots.

BARBERS HILL EAGLES — Starters Returning O/D: 7/6. 2019: 11-2 regional semi-finalist/ 7-0 district. The Eagles had a nice run last year and with the help of a bevy of starters there is no reason why they cannot do it again. Wide Receiver Cameron Cauley is a speedster and finished with 49-catches for nearly 1,000 yards and 16 touchdowns while running back Garret Hagler gives Barbers Hill some balance in the run game. DL Josh King-Bradley leads the defense and is a two-time first-team all-district selection.

CROSBY COUGARS — Starters Returning O/D: 7/7. 2019: 6-5 area-finalist/ 5-2 district. Crosby can score with the best of them and with quarterback Reggie Branch (1,800 yards of offense, 22 touchdowns), back and athlete Deniquez Dunn (2,100 yards of offense, 19 touchdowns) back to lead the offense the scoreboard should be lighting up again. LB/WR Michael Ray is a two-way starter and should be one of the leaders on defense.

KINGWOOD PARK PANTHERS — Starters Returning O/D: 5/4. 2019: 6-5 bi-district finalist/ 5-2 district. The Panthers have some major pieces back on offense with QB Hudson Dezell, RB Juan Garcia, and ATH Hayden Bender so they also could be problems for defenses.

NEDERLAND BULLDOGS — Starters Returning O/D: 5/6. 2019: 4-7 bi-district finalist/ 4-3 district. The Bulldogs did not have the win total they are used to in 2019 with just four, but there are some pieces that could be enough for another post-season birth. RB Josh Mazyck rushed for over 1,000 yards last season and 12 touchdowns while RB Kade Scott should give Nederland a nice duel-threat in the backfield.

PORT NECHES-GROVES INDIANS — Starters Returning O/D: 5/4. 2019: 7-4 bi-district finalist/ 5-2 district. The Indians return one of the best quarterbacks in the area in Blake Bost (2,500 yards passing, 15 TDs, 358 yards, 9 TDs rushing). His favorite target is also back from a year ago in wide receiver Brady Nail.

SANTE FE INDIANS — Starters Returning O/D: 5/6. 2019: 2-8/ 1-6 district. The Santa Fe defense returns six starters and they are all good ones in Bruce Erikson, Tyler Trexler, and Keyler Thompson. The running game could also be good as Trevor Trevino and Tristen Cundiff look to lead the offense.

TEXAS CITY STINGAREES — Starters Returning O/D: 6/7. 2019: 2-8/ 2-5 district. Texas City drops down from 5A Division I to Division II and with some seasoned players returning, the Stings are looking to make a return to the playoffs. Running back Semaj McCall rushed for nearly 1,100 yards and nine scores in 2019 while Jacob Duran will be the signal caller.

Hardin Hornets are hard at it

While facemasks may be a common term in the world of football, social distancing certainly does not come to mind, but in the year 2020 a lot of things are different, especially for the Hardin Hornets football program as they welcome in a new coaching staff and totally new look on the playing field heading into the 2020 season.

You will see some familiar faces returning on the squad, but a number of returners will find themselves in some new positions and new roles on the playing field under the tutelage of new Head Coach Ned Barrier and company.

"We have moved a bunch of kids around, kind of a different offense and different defensive scheme, so we are moving them around and trying them at different places and playing them at multiple positions," Barrier said when asked about returners from last year's campaign that went 3-7, with a 1-6 record for the seventh place spot in District 12-3A-Division I.

The standard routine for most school's is to have a formal spring workout period, which of course COVID-19 completely laid waste to, and summer drills were in no way routine. Take these elements and toss in the late hiring of Barrier and his staff it has created a very small window of opportunity for everyone involved to come together.

"We are still trying to learn them right now and they're still trying to learn us. We are going through the new process of trying to get to know everybody right now," Barrier noted.

Returning this season is the 2019 signal caller Austin Potetz, the senior was a First Team All-District selection a year ago. This season expect to see Potetz split his time at both quarterback, as well as wide receiver.

When Potetz is not behind center in the Hornet multi-set offense, expect to see

junior Caden Elmore taking the lead for Hardin.

Hardin faithful are sure to see a lot of hard nosed, run the ball style from the boys in blue and gold, with returning senior Anthony Yeo, junior Ryan Harris highlighting that running back corps.

"At running back we have a lot of kids, we are running kind of a different scheme and we have about 5 or 6 kids that are working at running back right now," Barrier said of his ball carriers.

At fullback you will see Mathew Hughes and Lahr Randolph likely at the blocking back position for the Hornets.

Clearing the way on the line this season is a very experienced group, led of course by senior standout Paul Thonsgaard, coming off a 2019 effort that landed him District 12-3A, Division I co-offensive lineman honors. Joining him on the line will be junior linemen Shane Holst and A.J. Scott, while sophomore Joshua Hessler will be joining the fray at the center position.

"Hessler has jumped out there and figured it out for us and he is looking pretty good there. Thonsgaard and Scott are playing guard and we are rotating a couple of people at the right tackle. We have moved Colby Barrett to tight end, as our tight ends are blocker type kids," Barrier said about his line.

Colby Barrett was a second team all-district selection a year ago and should add some major size to the tight end spot.

On the defensive side of the ball look for a 3-4 that is helmed by Thonsgaard at nose, while Barrett and Holst join him up front at the two defensive end spots.

In the center of the defense there is a healthy competition going on at the outside linebacker position, with a number of players vying for those two spots, while Harris and Hughes are tapped at the middle linebacker position.

"Right now we are just one day at a time, trying to do the best that we can for the next day. That's what we are in there doing

right now is planning practice and trying to have the best practice tomorrow. We are not looking too far down the road, because we don't know if we are going to get shutdown or if we are going to play and we are just trying to get better," Barrier said when asked about the unknown of this season amongst the threat of COVID-19.

"With a new coaching staff we really haven't got a chance to look at district opponents, we know who they are, but we haven't got a ton of film on them because we are still trying to learn our kids right now. We are trying to get us, to be the best that we can before we start looking at other people. We have Kountze next week and haven't really seen a lot of film on them. We are just a day by day group right now

and trying to get better tomorrow and move some kids around to give us the best chance to be successful," Barrier said.

The Hardin staff this year will consist of Cameron Terrell, defensive coordinator; Mitchell Villemez, special teams coordinator and linebackers; Heath Pavliska, wide receivers; Ivan Williams, running backs; Brontre Wright, offensive line; Jared Listenbee, defensive line; Brian Beck, running backs and linebackers; Dusty Collins wide receivers and secondary; and Dennis Diviney, offensive and defensive line.

Barrier had this to say about what he hopes fans will see from the Hornets



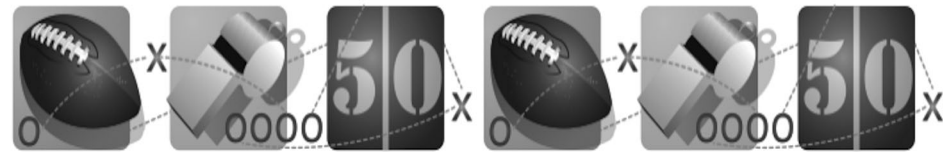

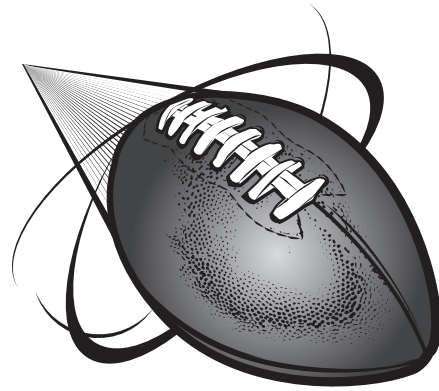

UIL allows for regular season high school football telecasts

In an effort to increase accessibility of high school football games and encourage social distancing across Texas, the UIL will allow live telecasts of high school football games on Friday nights during the regular season with the exception of linear telecasts [traditional over-the-air, cable and satellite broadcasts] on Sept. 25, 2020.

A telecast is defined as any live or tape-delayed video footage of a contest in its entirety that can be transmitted through television, Internet Web stream, Webcast, video podcast, smart phone apps, tablet computer apps, closed-circuit channels, weather cameras or any other medium.

This temporary suspension of Section 868(c) of the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules, which prohibits live telecasts of regular season football games on Friday, is only for the 2020-21 school year, and must be done in accordance with following:

- No linear telecasts will be permitted on Friday, Sept. 25, 2020 unless already permitted by Section 868(c) PILOT PROGRAM.

- Only webcasts will be permitted on Friday, Sept. 25, 2020.

- With prior approval by their school administration, the Home Team may have one digital webcast transmitted on the Internet and one linear telecast on television per game, provided that there is adequate space for the Visiting Team webcast production.

- With prior approval by their school administration, the Visiting Team may have one digital webcast transmitted on the Internet per game.

- Webcasts may be on any media platform approved by the school.

- All telecasts must adhere to UIL telecast guidelines and advertisement restrictions.

UIL FOOTBALL LIVE TELECAST GENERAL GUIDELINES

If providing announcers as part of the telecast, announcers should follow the following announcer guidelines:

- The telecast should provide announcers who are competent and exhibit professionalism.

- No dramatization shall be made of any unsportsmanlike conduct, incidents or displays on the part of the participants or fans.

- There shall be no destructive criticisms of officials' decisions.

- No mention shall be made of injuries, unpreventable accidents, or other incidents which may cause any anxiety on the part of the viewers.

PRESS BOX GUIDELINES

- The host venue should make every attempt to accommodate both the Home and Visitor Team production crews for telecasts and webcasts while following all social distancing recommendations, face covering requirements, and other health related recommendations by their local and state authorities.

- Press box capacity should include at least six feet between individuals when possible, and all individuals are required to wear face coverings.

- Schools should limit production crews to those individuals essential to the telecast.

ADVERTISEMENT RESTRICTIONS

The following categories are prohibited during telecasts of any UIL activities:

- Political announcements
- Cigarettes or other tobacco product
- Gambling services or venues
- Sexual services or adult entertainment venues
- Alcohol and firearms advertisements

Alleged violations of these provisions fall under the jurisdiction of the District and State Executive Committees. Violations will be subject to the range of penalties listed in the UIL Constitution and Contest Rules.

Any negotiations regarding telecasts are at the discretion of the school district and must be in compliance with UIL rules. All revenues generated belong to the entities involved in the agreement.

UIL Guidelines for Spectators, Audiences, Fans and Media

Schools may allow spectators to attend games, contests, or events within a maximum 50% capacity limitation, provided that appropriate spacing between spectators is maintained according to the protocol, and according to the following:

Schools and/or host sites should post visible signs and/or messaging stating any individuals who are confirmed to have, suspected of having, are experiencing symptoms of, or have been in close contact with an individual who has been confirmed to have COVID-19 should not enter the facility.

Spectators, audiences, fans and media are required to wear face coverings as described in Executive Order GA-29.

Sites are encouraged to utilize remote ticketing options to help manage capacity limitations within a maximum 50% occupancy. Paper tickets and programming should be minimized to help avoid transferable materials.

If possible, set reserved times for entry to avoid mass arrivals.

Groups should maintain at least six feet of distance from other groups at all times, including the process of admission and seating. A group is defined as no more than 10 people including the members of the household and those persons who traveled together to the facility.

Schools should not allow seating in consecutive rows, and should block off seating to maintain a minimum six feet of distance between groups.

Pathways for spectator ingress and egress should be clearly marked and unobstructed.

Schools should provide hand sanitizing stations and/or hand washing stations at entrances and inside the facility.

Seating, hand rails, and other common surfaces should be cleaned and disinfected prior to each game or contest.

Press Box seating should include social distancing of at least six feet between individuals when possible.

Schools should limit access to working media providing coverage of the event to ensure protocols are followed.

Post-game interviews should be conducted while wearing face coverings and maintaining at least six feet of distance between the interviewer and individual being interviewed.
