School Board hires new Superintendent

As the votes from the Caldwell Parish School Board were read at their meeting on February 13, the suspense grew. The votes were 3 for Angela Gullatt and 3 for Nicki McCann. The final and seventh vote was for McCann. Randy Rentz said it was a tough decision with two very qual-

ified applicants. Baron Glass said he hoped there would not be any retaliation for those that wanted a different outcome. Judith McKee said that it is all about the children. The votes were cast as follows: Dr. John Robinson – Gullatt, Judith McKee – McCann, Baron Glass – Gullatt, Randy Rentz – McCann,

James King – Gullatt, Gary Cassels – McCann, C. R. Martin – McCann.

Corrections were made to the minutes from meeting held on December 17, 2019, January 9, 21, and 28, 2020. The board approved the changes.

Monica Coates, Director of Early Childhood Development, gave an

update on the Head Start and Pre-K programs. Head Start is fully enrolled with 68 students. No more can be added without more staff. Pre-K has 106 enroll with 27 of them being from Head Start. The programs are at their maximum for grants. Coates discussed delegation of duties and said that job descriptions need to be clearly stated. She also said that based on research and data there are not enough 3-year old children in Caldwell Parish to qualify for the Head Start program. There are 9 students that are in Pre-K that are over income and 6 in Head Start. They are allowed a small percentage of students for the over income placements.

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Caldwell Parish School Board will be held on Thursday, March 12, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.

Soil workshop, field day set in St. Joe

ST. JOSEPH, La. — The LSU AgCenter Northeast Research Station will host a soil health workshop and cover crop field day Feb. 26 in St. Joseph.

Registration will begin 8:30 a.m. followed by the program from 9 until 4 p.m. A sponsored lunch will be provided.

The event will highlight soil health and regenerative agriculture pre-

sented by recent LSU graduate Kathleen Bridges.

A field tour of the research station will cover current research on legume seeding rates, nematode suppression with cover crops, tillage and cover crop three-way rotations, and a 12-species cover crop trial looking at broadcast versus drill planting and termination timing.

In a hands-on workshop, farmers will use biomass collected during the field tour to review technology resources available for nutrient analysis.

Other presentations will include soil health dynamics and strategies, economics of best management practices and updates on the Patrick F. Taylor Foundation grant project.

The meeting will conclude with a producer panel and open forum.

USACE holds hunt for hunters with disabilities

VICKSBURG, Miss. — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Vicksburg District's Louisiana Field Office held a deer hunt for hunters with physical disabilities Jan. 18 at Columbia Lock and Dam, located approximately seven miles upstream of Columbia, Louisiana.

Seven hunters with disabilities that limit mobility participated in the hunt. No deer were harvested during the event.

Hunters received a safety briefing from field office personnel before being escorted to their hunting blinds. Caldwell Parish Sheriff Clay Bennett and field office personnel provided a complimentary fish fry lunch to the hunters and the event's volunteers.

The purpose of the hunt is to allow people with physical disabilities to enjoy hunting and the great outdoors in a way that they may not nor-

mally be able to experience. Each year, the field office holds the hunt for people with disabilities in late January and a hunt for combat veterans and their families in early December.

The hunt was made possible through collaboration from community and government entities as well as participation from volunteers and sponsors. The field office was proud to play a part in the hunters' experience and looks forward to next year's event.

Artist and Architect M. Douglas Walton is a very prolific and spiritual painter. You can see his exhibit at the Schepis through March. His current exhibit, Art of the Heart, came about after having triple by-pass surgery in January 2019. Walton said his nurse told him he should do an exhibit by that name. The result of his work in the last year, with most being painted in the last 3 months is a colorful explosion of images that contain a heart in some fashion. On many pieces are delicate glass hearts that he purchased on one of his many trips to San Miguel, Mexico.

To say Walton is an interesting person is an understatement. Because he couldn't speak with consonants he didn't learn to talk until he went to a clinic in

Kansas when he was fourteen. He has been painting for 48 years. Walton was asked to be an assistant professor of Architect at LA Tech. He said he was born to teach, and it was a gift. From there he has been teaching all over the world. He has been to Bali 29 times, to San Miguel, Nepal and all over the world. He was in Nepal April 2015 when they had an 8.1 earthquake. Walton was at the epicenter of the quake and stayed in a refugee camp for 6 days. He said it was a spiritual and metaphysical experience and one of the best times of his life. Children would sprinkle flower petals on the trails for them to walk on. One Nepalese took his hand and said you will speak the truth through your paintings, thus inspiring his Nepal paintings. Several of his Nepal

paintings are at his current exhibit at the Schepis. Most of them have a stick in the middle of a canvas or between two canvases. This he calls a pivot. When something major happens in your life you can go to the light or

the dark. Walton said his paintings today are at this level as a result of Nepal. What some consider a terrible event ended up being a most glorious time because of the Nepalese peoples love of spirituality.

Taking Care of Each Other

"Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself." Leviticus 19:18 NIV

In the nineteenth chapter of Leviticus there are some interesting remarks about how we should care for our fellow man. In addition to the well-known commandments to honor our father and mother, and to not lie or steal, we are told the following: "Do not curse the deaf or put a stumbling block in front of the blind, but fear your God." (Leviticus 19:14 NIV) And a little further on we are instructed "Do not do anything that endangers your neighbor's life." (Leviticus 19:16 NIV) A careful reading of this chapter of the Bible reveals that almost everything we need to know is there concerning the care of our fellow man, and proper behavior in general, from issues of justice, to proper behavior towards our families and the less fortunate and even what we might consider rules of etiquette. Many of the rules of etiquette haven't changed much: "Stand up in the presence of the aged, show respect for the elderly and revere your God." (Leviticus 19:32 NIV) In considering our

behavior, we should of course be asking whether we are breaking any of the ten commandments. But we should also be asking more basic questions. Are we endangering our neighbor's life, for instance, by drinking and driving, or by driving too fast? Are we putting stumbling blocks in front of the disabled, or cursing them? (That we are told to not curse the deaf indicates that it doesn't matter if they hear us; we should not be "complaining inwardly" about people with disabilities.) And finally, are we doing our best to act justly and fairly towards everyone, and exercising compassion towards all? -Christopher Simon

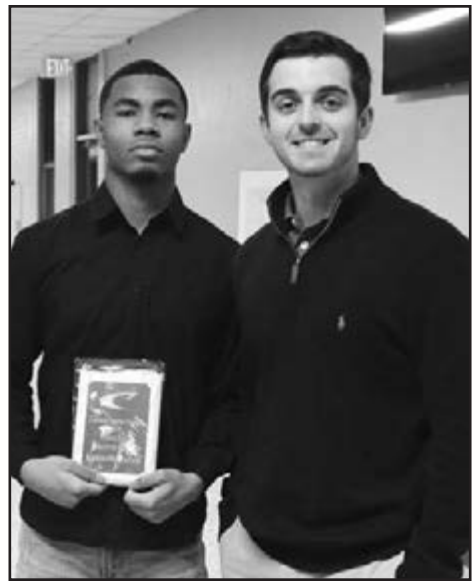

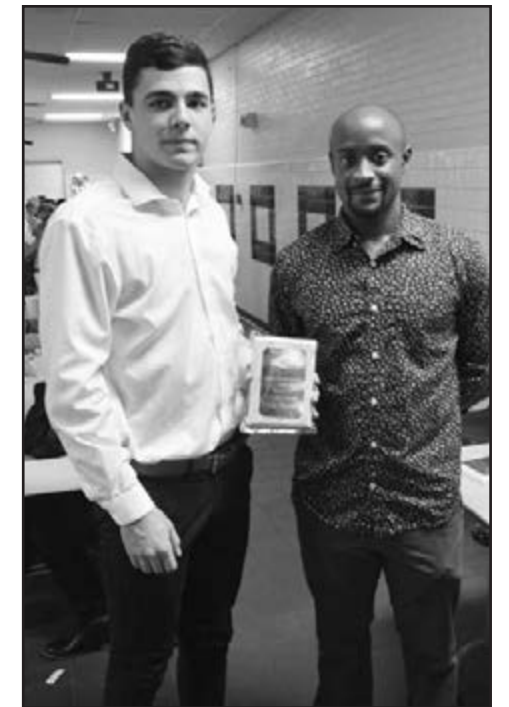

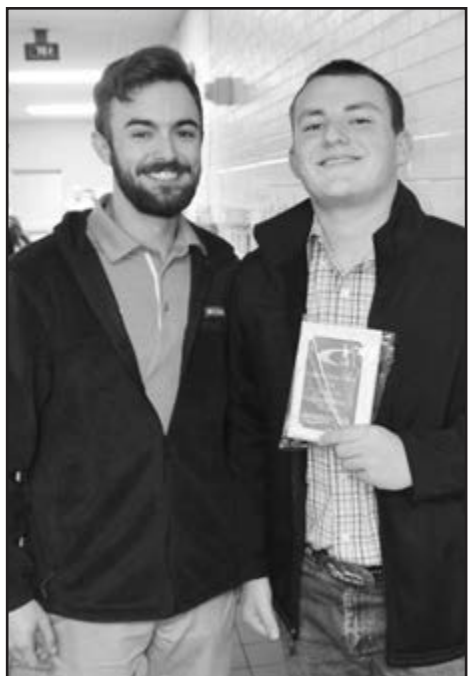
