The following constitutional amendments will also be on the ballot as well as an amendment for Caldwell Parish.

Constitutional Amendment No. 1 (ACT 447, 2019 - HB 425) - Relating to Right to and Funding of Abortion (Select 1)

Do you support an amendment declaring that, to protect human life, a right to abortion and the funding of abortion shall not be found in the Louisiana Constitution? (Adds Article I, Section 20.1)

A "yes" vote supports adding language to the Louisiana Constitution stating that "nothing in this constitution shall be construed to secure or protect a right to abortion or require the funding of abortion."

A "no" vote opposes adding language to the Louisiana Constitution stating that "nothing in this constitution shall be construed to secure or protect a right to abortion or require the funding of abortion."

Constitutional Amendment No. 2 (ACT 368 - HB 360) - Amends Determination of Fair Market Value of Oil or Gas Well (Select 1)

Do you support an amendment to permit the presence or production of

oil or gas to be included in the methodology used to determine the fair market value of an oil or gas well for the purpose of property assessment? (Amends Article VII, Section 4(B))

A "yes" vote supports this amendment to allow the presence or production of oil or gas to be taken into account when determining the fair market value of an oil or gas well for ad valorem taxes.

A "no" vote opposes taking the presence or production of oil or gas into account when determining the fair market value of an oil or gas well for ad valorem taxes.

Constitutional Amendment No. 3 (Act 367 - HB 267) - Amends Use of Budget Stabilization Fund (Select 1)

Do you support an amendment to allow for the use of the Budget Stabilization Fund, also known as the Rainy Day Fund, for state costs associated with a disaster declared by the federal government? (Amends Article VII, Section 10.3(C)(3) and (4); Adds Article VII, Section 10.3(A)(5) and (C)(5))

A "yes" vote supports amending the state constitution to allow the Louisiana State Legislature, through a two-thirds vote in each chamber, to use up to one-third of the revenue in the Budget Stabilization Fund (also known as the Rainy Day Fund) to cover the state's costs associated with a federally-declared disaster.

A "no" vote opposes amending the state constitution to allow the Louisiana State Legislature to use up to one-third of the revenue in the Budget Stabilization Fund to cover the state's costs associated with a federally-declared disaster, thereby maintaining the restricted use of the

The number of positive cases in Caldwell Parish as of Monday, October 28th at Noon is 355 with 3 deaths. There have been 5,744 commercial tests given and 195 state tests given. Louisiana reports 180,069 cases with 5,648 deaths. There are 609 cases reported in the hospital, with 71 reported on ventilation. It is reported that 165,282 are presumed recovered. For the state of Louisiana there have been 2,698,833 tests given.

The deadline to request an absentee by mail ballot is Dec. 1 by 4:30 p.m. You can request an absentee by mail ballot online through our Voter Portal or in writing through your Registrar

of Voters Office (other than military and overseas voters).

The deadline for a registrar of voters to receive a voted mail ballot is Dec. 4 by 4:30 p.m. (other than military and overseas voters).

Dear Editor,
“While the bill passed by the legislature today is a positive step forward, it does not go far enough to

address the imbalance that exists in our current emergency powers structure. That said, we appreciate lawmakers coming together throughout the legislative process to advance a compromise measure to the Governor’s desk. Checks and balances are a

bedrock principle of the American system of government, and HB 4 is a positive step toward adding the oversight needed in Louisiana’s emergency declarations process.

We call on the Governor to join legislative leadership in support-

ing this change to current policy and to foster a system that favors collaboration with other elected officials over unilateral power.”

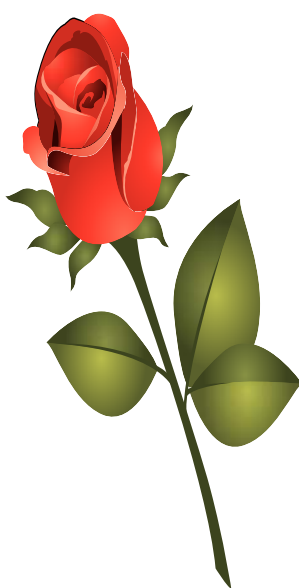

Constitutional Amendment No. 4 (ACT 366 - HB 464) - Limits Expenditure Limit for State General Fund (Select 1)

Do you support an amendment to limit the growth of the expenditure limit for the state general fund and dedicated funds and to remove the calculation of its growth factor from the Constitution? (Effective June 30, 2022) (Amends Article VII, Section 10(C)(1))

A "yes" vote supports amending the state consti-

to remove the existing expenditure limit formula and allow the Louisiana Legislature to enact a state spending limit formula through statute that does not allow more than 5 percent growth per year.

A "no" vote opposes amending the state constitution to allow the Louisiana Legislature to enact a state spending formula through statute capped at 5 percent growth, thereby maintaining the existing constitutional formula that caps state spending growth at the prior year's spending limit multi-

plied by the average annual percentage rate of change of personal income for Louisiana for the three years prior.

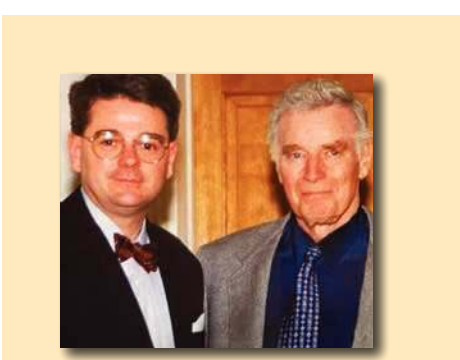

Creates Louisiana Unclaimed Property Permanent Trust Fund (Select 1)

Do you support an amendment to create the Louisiana Unclaimed Property Permanent Trust Fund to preserve the money that remains unclaimed by its owner or owners? (July 1, 2021) (Adds Article VII, Sections 10(F)(4)(i) and 28)

A "yes" vote supports amending the state constitution to:

- create the Unclaimed Property (UCP) Permanent Trust Fund, with the fund earmarked for payment of claims made by owners of abandoned property;
- allocate funds above administrative costs received due to the Uniform Unclaimed Property Act of 1997 (or its successor) to the UCP Permanent Trust Fund until equal to the state's estimated unclaimed property potential liability;
- allocate any additional unclaimed property receipts and any investment revenue from the UCP Permanent Trust Fund to the state's general fund; and
- authorize the treasurer to invest up to 50% of the UCP Permanent Trust Fund in equities.

A "no" vote opposes this amendment to create the Unclaimed Property Permanent Trust Fund, dedicate fund revenue to paying claims from owners of unclaimed property, and allocate investment revenue and unclaimed property revenue above the state's estimate unclaimed property liability to the state's general fund.
