EC Offensive Change Rumors may be Exaggerated

Retirement of O-line boss, run game guru Behlmer, starts talk again.

ST. LEON - Off-season rumors concerning East Central football seem to fly every year. They've been active as ever in 2021, following the retirement of longtime Trojan O-line boss/strength coach/run game guru Tim Behlmer - the EC all-timer who graduated in the very first year of the consolidation's existence, 1974.

Is this finally the season in which the perennial Class 4A state gridiron powerhouse - entering its third year under another former Trojan standout, head coach Jake Meiners - finally gears up the air game in favor of a more balanced offense?

"Rumors fly around every offseason that are simply not true," says Meiners, 19-4 in his 2 years at the helm. "Every offseason coaches evaluate where improvements can be made. We are no different."

He adds quickly: "In saying that, we have an identity at EC that will not change. We will play stout defense and lean heavily on our run game. That identity has been around since the early days of the EC program, and has proven to be very successful."

What's more: "We have another special group of offensive lineman that will lead us offensively. We also have a ton of talent in

the backfield."

Just to keep them guessing, however, he noted: "I do believe that we have a lot of talent at the wide receiver position, and have the capability of throwing the football - if that's what the defense is giving us. Both quarterbacks, Carson Koelling (6'0", 168-pound junior) and Cole Burton (5'11", 184, sophomore), have the ability to run and push the ball down the field, which will allow us to be pretty dynamic."

For good measure, Coach Meiners reminds: "Our defense should be solid again. There has been some pretty intense competition between our offense and defense this offseason."

While East Central's 8-3 season of 2020 may have appeared substandard, in light of the Trojans' always-lofty standards, let us be reminded. Last year's 3 losses went to a pair of Indiana state champions (Class 3A Indianapolis Chatard, 4A Indy Roncalli) and 4A regional champ Mooresville.

"Expectations are always high in St. Leon, and this year is no different," Meiners acknowledges. "We want to win every game that we play. Like every year, our goal is to win the EIAC, win the sectional and make a deep run in the playoffs. Our team discusses these expectations all of the time. Our players understand the tradition that has been set before them. And they want to cement their own history in our program."

To steal a line from the Ghostbusters, the Trojans certainly have the tools - and the talent - to accomplish all 3 goals.

Everything starts up front for EC football, and the revamped offensive line will anchor around 2 seniors, captain Casey McQueen (6'4", 250) and Noah Houser (6'2", 251), an All-EIAC D-line performer last year.

Although the Trojans threw the football

only in case of emergency last fall, top receiver Nate Buesing (6'2", 180, Sr.) impressed enough to earn All-EIAC, and is a team captain.

Featured backs in the still-formidable run game looked to be 3 seniors heading into the preseason, including Grant Ernst (6'0", 216), versatile RB/DB Samuel Ringer (6'0", 180) and rugged Hunter Sohns (5'10", 195). But don't be shocked if the show is stolen again by sophomore Josh Ringer, Sam's beastly 6'2", 185-pound sibling, who led EC in rushing (714 yards, 9.2 per carry, 9 TDs, 5 games of 100+) in just 7 contests as an injury sub.

Although the linebacker corps was hit hard by graduation, expect East Central's defense to be traditionally strong again. Senior Ryan

Bovard (5'10", 219) and junior Louis Gray (5'11", 200) are the stud veterans up front, with Sohns and senior David Nash (5'11", 190) the most experienced repeaters from the LB rotation.

EC's defensive secondary should be an area of strength, with the return of All-EIAC vets Cooper Hoog (6'1", 170, Sr.) at corner, as well as team captain, and Sam Ringer at free safety, along with speedsters classmates Charlie Euson (6'0", 167) and Jack Rinear (6'1", 155).

East Central has special teams covered again, as well, with All-EIAC placekicker and girls soccer conference defensive MVP Sophie Browndyke (40-48 XPs, 3-4 FG, long 36, 46.5 avg. kickoffs) back for her final double-duty fall. The Ringer boys will handle punting duties again.

Trojan football always has thrived on a fresh infusion of talent from its endlessly successful JV and freshman teams each year, and the trend will continue in 2021.

Key newcomers who could arise in areas of need include D-line seniors Sean Behrle (5'11", 208) and Ethan Greiwe (6'0", 213) and linebackers Jake Blake (6'3", 170, Sr.), Adam Rosemeyer (6'2", 183, Jr.), Rhett Smith (5'11", 163, Jr.) and Connor Kuhn (5'9", 185, So.).

While the secondary should be solid, ju-

nior Andrew Roy (5'7", 135) and soph Jace Dorsey (6'2", 166) are new guys who have earned their share of playing time.

EC's offensive line rotation will be bolstered by senior newbies Lucas Adams (6'0", 280) and Luke Vogelgesang (6'2", 235), along with sophomore Noah Schneider (6'2", 277).

Skill position rookies who could see playing time include junior Trae Ohmer (5'10", 165) at RB and junior Eli Aston (5'11", 160) and sophomore Ryan Brotherton (6'4", 180) at WR.

East Central's 2021 varsity football schedule could well be its most demanding ever, dropping longtime EIAC rival Greensburg in favor of perennial Carmel-area 3A parochial toughie Guerin Catholic.

As usual, the Trojans' dance card is front- and back-loaded, starting with 3 season-hinging matchups (at Lawrenceburg Friday, vs. Harrison Aug. 27, vs. Cincinnati Moeller Sept. 3) and finishing at Guerin (Oct. 8) and Roncalli (Oct. 15) just prior to the playoffs.

Meiners admits: "This might be one of the tougher schedules in EC history. But our goal is to continue to elevate our program by playing premier games and preparing ourselves for the playoffs."

While the core of EC's deep and talented coaching staff remains essentially the same, there's no way to quantify how the absence of the legendary Behlmer's wisdom, experience and relentless intensity may play out.

"It will definitely be different, not to have him on the sidelines this year," Meiners says. "Randy Maxwell and Steven Medlock have taken over the offensive line position, and are doing a great job."

Another new wrinkle, which again fuels those pesky rumors, was the hiring of former Columbus North offensive coordinator Louis Sipe as quarterbacks coach. Another EC football legacy, longtime assistant Doug Hoog, slides to the defensive coordinator spot.

All the moving parts boil down to a few football basics, in Jake Meiners' view.

"In order for us to be successful this season, we really need to focus on possessing the football and getting off of the field defensively," he said. "We were close in each of our 3 losses last season. But we did not execute in all phases well enough to win.

"We must create turnovers and play aggressive defense. On offense, we need to control the clock, limit turnovers and score points. We struggled at times to finish drives with points last season.

"But I have a ton of confidence in this group, and I think that we might surprise a few people."

Great offseason leads to excitement

More experienced Wildcats expect 'bigger' things in 2021

On the first day of official practice for the 2021 football season, 2020 lingered in the air at Harrison High School Aug. 2 – and that's not necessarily bad.

More than 90 players participated in drills on the stadium field and practice field just to the west. The anxiety and stress of a year ago were gone, but the lessons learned in the 3-7 campaign remained as a motivator. Eighteen days before the season opener, the focus was clear. The coach was in a good mood.

"Offseason was great. The summer was great, the kids were perfect. They bought in, they came. We worked hard. I was really happy. It was really just a pleasant feeling. Good feeling," Derek Rehage said.

Rehage begins his fifth season; his fourth was the program's first losing season since 2012, when the Wildcats were 4-6. The 2020 team was 3-7, but did win a playoff game, in week seven vs. Lima Senior, and the finale, Oct. 30 vs. Taylor. Officially, the regular season was six games, followed by playoffs, for which every school "qualified." Teams eliminated from the playoffs could then add more games, to a total of 10.

The Wildcats were in every game but two, with a four-point loss at Chaminade Julienne in the opener, a 10-point loss to Talawanda and a three-point loss in overtime at Edge-

wood, a game in which they took a 35-28 lead in the final minute, only to give up a late tying touchdown.

"One of the things I always say to the kids, 'when you learn the most is probably when you fail,'" Rehage said. "So what did you learn the most about yourself, as a coach, as a program is when you fail, and in anybody's mind 2020 wasn't our best season. Happy that we got to play, but our goals and expectations are higher and you can see the fire within our kids right now. They are hungry, everything's 'yes sir, no sir.' They do exactly as I say, and they've been great."

They are hungry, and they are also bigger – most notably along the offensive and defensive lines, where Harrison was often giving up 30 pounds or more on average in 2020, and played several freshmen most of the season.

"I'd say in my nine years in the program now would be the first time that all five starters are 200-pounds plus," Rehage said. "We're now 220-plus at all five, which is the biggest we've ever had. We even have one 300-pounder. We're all over six foot (tall), too." Senior Alex Peak, a second-team All-Southwest Ohio Conference selection last season, leads the group.

That group will protect senior quarterback Mason Young, the SWOC's leading passer in his first season as a starter. Young completed 148 of 308 attempts for 1,863 yards, 15 touchdowns and eight interceptions. His 92-yard touchdown pass to then-senior D.J. Diesman, in week three vs. Mount Healthy, set a school record.

Young also ran the ball 163 times for 576 yards and seven touchdowns. Some of the runs were designed; many were improvised because the line broke down and he was forced to scramble. Even with an improved line, expect to see Young "tuck and run" this season.

"His decision-making is better. He's just

trusting his receivers, and if it's not there he's taking off, which is probably his best attribute," Rehage said.

The receiving corps is young and deep. Harrison, under Rehage, traditionally uses four-receiver formations. Five players caught 12 or more passes in 2020, but almost a third of the 150 receptions came from running back Cam Hering. Among those returning, senior Nathan Blank caught 23 passes for 211 yards, and juniors Gavin Moore and Ben Smith caught one each.

Cade Combs, Brian Guthrie, Lucas Neckel and Luke Rogers are vying for playing time at receiver. Combs, a senior basketball and baseball player, is in his first varsity football season. "We'll play six or seven guys out there," Rehage said.

Harrison quarterback Mason Young (8), a first-year starter as a junior in 2020, threw for 1,863 yards, 15 touchdowns, and rushed for 576 and another 7 scores, earning All-SWOC Honorable Mention.

Moore, who Rehage has said is one of the fastest players in the program, moves over from defense to tailback this year, replacing Hering. He started at quarterback in week nine vs. Oak Hills, when Young was ill. For the season, he ran the ball six times for 20 yards.

“Cam is a little bit different than Gavin. Gavin is definitely more of a power guy. Runs downhill, lowers his shoulder. He’s physical at the point of attack. All that good stuff,” Rehage said.

Five of 11 starters return on defense, and Rehage said the defensive backs will be the strength of the team. The Wildcats intercepted five passes in 2020 – four by Dom Little, including a school record three in one game vs. Mount Healthy, and one by Hering. Little has also graduated.

Harrison allowed 313.2 yards per game – 211 rushing and 102.2 passing – a season ago, giving up 21.9 points per game.

“The DBs are really good. The strength of the defense by far. Five seniors start back

there, and then we’ve got some young players, but there’s some size. It’s the same thing up front. All three starters are 240-plus. I mean that’s the one thing we got right now is we’ve got some size. First time in a long time,” Rehage said.

That size will be crucial if Harrison is to contend for the SWOC championship. Most SWOC teams prefer to run the ball. Harrison’s 187.5 yards per game passing was second in the league to Northwest’s 193 (in nine games). No other school had more than 75. By contrast, the Wildcats were last in the league in rushing yards (92.9 per game).

“Whoever can stop the run the best will win this league,” Rehage said. “Ross, Edgewood, everybody wants to run the ball. That’s how you win football games in the fall, late in the fall, run the ball when people know you’re going to run it, stop the run when

they’ve got to run it.” Harrison allowed 211 yards per game on the ground in 2020.

This season, 448 teams will qualify for the postseason in Ohio – 16 from each region, twice as many as in 2019, the last “normal” season, meaning the regular season begins a week earlier. The top eight teams in each region will host first-round games, and the top four remaining will host second-round games.

Harrison opens at home Aug. 20 vs. Division IV Wyoming, which is 62-4 since the 2016 season. The Wildcats visit East Central Aug. 27 and Miamisburg Sept. 3 before hosting Division III Trotwood Madison and Division IV Clinton-Massie, which has lost nine games in five years. The SWOC schedule begins Sept. 24 at Talawanda.

“You know the goal here is not just to get in, but it’s to win playoff games and go far and play for regional championships and stuff like that. So in order to beat those kind of teams in the playoffs, you have to play them in the regular season,” Rehage said.

Hit hard by graduation losses after last year's injury-wracked 4-5 season, South Dearborn football looks for some better luck as the 2021 campaign opens vs. Seymour Friday, Aug. 20, at Backman Field. Ballart expects returning senior ends Cooper Barker and Billy Schulte to produce crucial stops this season.

Andrew Kemper and first-year senior Landon Walton should make a strong tandem at the noseguard spot, while hard-nosed junior veteran Sean Sohmer will be a key anchor in the middle.

Linebackers Ashton Kittle and Brayden Johnson, along with defensive backs Blake Lagaly, Ryan Willoughby and Corbin Cassidy all are expected to play significant parts on defense.

Coach Ballart is enthused by the return of senior Drew Probst, sidelined all of last year with an ACL injury that occurred in the first week.

"He's fired up and ready to go," said the head coach. "And, I'll tell you, he's exciting to watch out there."

"Our secondary, we feel, is pretty strong. Coach (Jon) Krath, our defensive coordinator, Coach (Doug) Otto and Coach (Walt) Luthy do a wonderful job on the defensive side, getting those guys ready."

Offensively, the coaching staff is optimistic for the upcoming season. Although SD has struggled to find its niche up front in the past, Ballart says he has a solid group of re-

turning athletes.

Senior Ely Gabbard (6'5", 290) gets the start at center, with solid senior tackles Evan Meek (6'2", 301) and Alex Kemper (6'3", 289) also playing key roles on the offensive front.

Expect to see a trio of talented South Dearborn quarterbacks take to the air with a little more frequency than in seasons past. Junior incumbent Logan Thies and sophomores Reid Thornton and Adam Kunkel all are aiming to take the reins offensively this season.

"We kind of have a quarterback battle going on over here," Ballart said. "It has been kind of fun to watch that progress over the summer."

"Absolute beast" senior running back CJ Rogers will be a player to watch on offense, as well as rangy (6'3", 171) junior Justin McGraw, along with classmates Braden Foist and Brady Roberts.

Senior wide receivers Isaiah Otto, Reese Willoughby, Aiden Pittenger and Austin Ballart, plus junior Adam Gainor should give whomever wins the QB battle a wide variety of targets.

"Our offense is going to be clicking," Ballart predicted. "If we can keep our defense

solid, like we feel it will be, and give the offense a chance to get the ball back and sling it around a little bit, we should be OK. We look to throw the ball quite a bit this year."

Kicking off their first full season playing on the artificial turf at Backman Stadium, funded by the Aurora Casket Company's founding family, the Knights hope to find success during the regular season, and beyond, after last year's altered season due to COVID-19.

Tigers Looking For Peak year in EIAC.

Record-setting offense returns trio of All-State performers

LAWRENCEBURG - Various sports publications already have tagged Lawrenceburg High School's football Tigers as a legitimate contender for Indiana's Class 3A state title.

Granted, plenty of things have to break right for Coach Ryan Knigga's LHS varsity, 11-2 sectional champions each of the last 2 seasons.

But Lawrenceburg certainly presents a prime pedigree on paper, returning a trio of Junior All-State award winners, including record-breaking fourth-year QB Garrett Yoon, game-breaking wide receiver Dahya Patel and - oh yes - the Tigers' first-ever Notre Dame commit in 6'5", 283-pound 2-way lineman Ashton Craig.

"As a program we always have high expectations," Knigga said. "We have a very talented group of kids who have played in

a ton of games. We have players who have played on big stages in championship games, and now it is time to cash in on that experience."

Tiger football also brings back a total of 9 all-conference performers, including EIAC 3A Division Offensive MVP Yoon and Defensive MVP Aiden Gilmour, another 2-way standout at wide receiver and defensive back. Although Lawrenceburg's potent offense will draw most of the spotlights, the Tigers' top repeating talent is almost equally divided on both sides of the ball. Offensively, LHS also returns bruising fullback Jake Pierce, as well as guards Colton Roth and Braydon Watkins. All-EIAC defenders Jayce Bohan and Lucas Pierce join Gilmour in one of the toughest secondary units anywhere around.

Yoon, a six-foot, 180-pound dual threat QB, is already the Tigers all-time passing leader in yardage (6,722) and touchdowns (69) after 3 full varsity seasons. Coming off a year in which he threw for 2,252 yards and ran for 1,083, scoring a whopping 41 TDs

(27 pass, 14 rush), he's also the No. 1 rushing QB in LHS history (2,781 yards), ranking seventh on the school's all-time list.

Yoon's top 2 receivers return in seniors Patel, an explosive 6'2", 175-pound All-State deep threat who notched 59 catches, 1,118 yards and 11 TDs last fall, and the equally athletic 5'9", 168-pound 2-way talent, a lockdown corner with 9 career interceptions who caught 29 balls for 548 yards and 11 TDs a year ago.

Also a vital cog both offensively and defensively, formidable Fighting Irish commit Craig - a 4-star college recruit rated eighth in Indiana's class of 2022 and the 30th OT

nationally, projected at center for ND - will anchor the Tigers' O-line and double at defensive tackle or end again, where he's carded 63 total stops, 5 sacks and 11.0 tackles for loss in his previous 3 varsity years.

Despite the graduation of top running back Adam Burd, LHS ground game should be in good shape with the Pierce brothers, both returning All-EIAC performers.

Senior Luke Pierce, a shifty, explosive 5'8", 155-pound runner and receiving threat, racked up 414 ground yards and 9 TDs a year ago. Doubling at LB/SS, he charted 60 tackles, one pick and 2 fumble recoveries.

Junior sibling Jake Pierce, a robust 6-foot, 205-pound H-back/TE/LB, scored 5 rushing TDs as an injury sub on offense, to go with his 62 tackles as a sophomore in 2020.

With 3 more experienced veterans back on the O-line, Tigers should have the muscle to move opponents in the run game, as well as protect Yoon when he drops to pass. Seniors Micah Foster (5'8", 218) and Braydon Watkins (6'0", 232) will be in the mix, with hard-nosed junior Colton Roth (6'1", 212).

Another senior, utility player Lance Bates (6-foot, 189) could help up front if he stays healthy, as could junior Logan Lange (5'11", 210), a starter last year before getting injured.

Defensive veterans returning are led by 2-time All-EIAC free safety Jayce Bohan (5'7", 143), with a career 116 tackles, 3 sacks, 2 interceptions and 2 recoveries.

There's also rangy (6'1", 165) junior line-backer Alex Witte, an aggressive hitter (49 tackles, 4 sacks last year) and playmaking junior cornerback Brennan Bushman, who started all 13 games last fall, registering 2 interceptions, including a pick-6 at Indy Arsenal Tech.

Lawrenceburg's newcomers, who could mean the difference between a good and great season, begin with South Dearborn OL transfer Jackson Goodall (6'3", 277) and dynamic sophomore RB/DB Teagan Bennett (5'9", 150), who got a taste of varsity action last fall, rushing for 137 yards and 3 TDs.

Sophomore wide-out Hayden Saylor (5'10", 149) could be a player to watch, along with 4 freshmen - RB/LB Logan Howell, TE Conner Lange, OL Logan Fehr and 6'3" LB Noah Knigga, the coach's son.

Two big factors on the Tigers' side entering the 2021 season - which kicks off Friday On Dick Meador Stadium/

Neary Memorial Field against East Central (8-3 last year) - are their offensive firepower and winning tradition.

In its last two 11-win seasons, LHS has piled up 40 or more points in 15 of those 22 games.

Going back 5 seasons, including its Class 3A state runner-up run in 2016, Lawrenceburg has posted 11 or more wins 4 times, for a .785 winning percentage (51-14).

"Our goals are no different than any other year," Knigga added. "We want to win the 3A conference. We want to win our program's 21st sectional title. We want to get the regional championship monkey off our back.

"Our best for the past 2 years has been getting to the regional and not advancing. Most programs would love to have the success we have had. But this year, our kids have a different mindset. Hopefully we can reach our goals, and more."

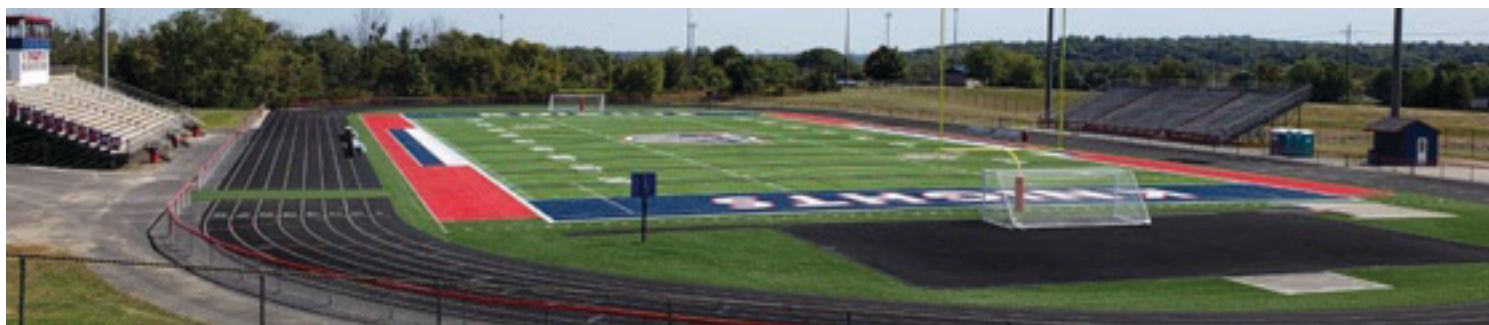

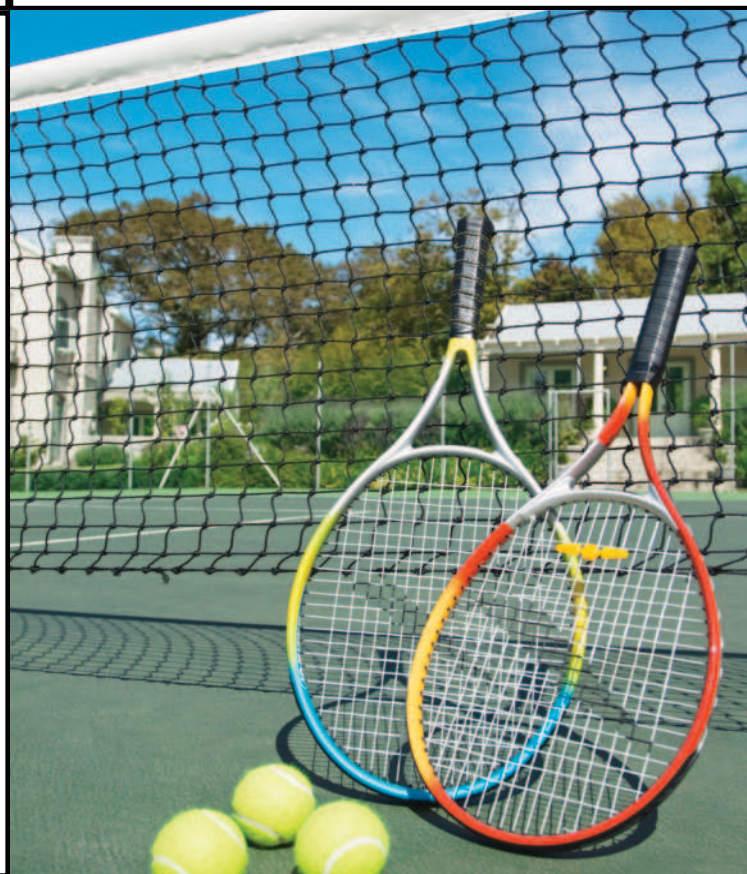

Brady Gabbard Memorial

Lawrenceburg football was devastated by the sudden loss of sophomore Brady Gabbard, just 13 days prior to his 15th birthday, Friday, July 2.

Only 2 weeks earlier, Brady was diagnosed with Stage 4 renal cell carcinoma, after masses were found on his liver and kidneys.

Renal cell carcinoma (RCC), also known as renal cell cancer or renal cell adenocarcinoma, is the most common type of kidney cancer. About 9 of 10 kidney cancers are renal cell carcinomas.

Although RCC usually grows as a single tumor within a kidney, sometimes 2 or more tumors can appear in one kidney, or even tumors in both kidneys at the same time.

Stage IV cancer is sometimes referred to as metastatic cancer, because it often means the cancer has spread from its origin to distant parts of the body.

A Go Fund Me Page, with the theme “A Tiger never fights alone”



was quickly set up to help the family with expenses, rapidly raising over \$50,000.

Brady enjoyed fishing. He liked all sports, especially football and baseball. He loved spending time with his friends and being outdoors. He was an avid fan of Xbox and loved his little sister.

A memorial service, followed by funeral services, were held at Lawrenceburg High School July 9, with burial in Greendale Cemetery.

Brady is survived by his mother, Jennifer Gabbard; sister Harper Turner; and mamaw Kay Gabbard, all of Lawrenceburg; grandpa Turk Gabbard of Dillsboro; aunt Dawn Beard of Dillsboro; 10 cousins - Payton, Kylie, Khloe, Max, Kristi, Timmy, Alix, Guy, Cara Beth and Cade; and numerous relatives, friends and teammates.

Cotherman inducted to IATCCC Hall of Fame

Longtime East Central High School coach, Steve Cotherman, was inducted into the Indiana Association of Track & Cross Country Coaches Hall of Fame as a member of its 2021 class Saturday, June 19.

An inductee under the IATCCC's Contributor category, Cotherman - who still coaches boys and girls cross country for the Trojans - coached EC's track and field teams for 37 years, including 36 as boys head coach, before retiring after 44-1/2 years as a Sunman-Dearborn School Corporation teacher in 2016.

"It sure is an honor, and at the same time it's very humbling," said the 70-year old Greendale resident. "We usually had the ceremony along with our coaches' clinic, in January or February, but the clinic was held virtually this past year, so they decided to do the Hall of Fame in the summer. It worked out pretty well.

"I've been going to these things for years and listening to the stories of all the inductees. I've sure enjoyed them. Now, to be a member, it's quite a thrill."

East Central's boys and girls track teams won a combined 31 conference and 32 sectional championships under his watch, while the cross country Trojans have claimed a total of 12 conference and 4 sectional titles. EC's invitational meet victories totaled 72 in track under Cotherman's tutelage, while cross country posts 52 - and still counting.

A 1968 graduate of Goshen High School, he ran cross country and track at Ball State

University from 1968-72.

Cotherman taught physical education and health at Bright Elementary (1972-73), North Dearborn Elementary (1973-78), East Central High School (1978-88) and Sunman-Dearborn Middle School (1988-2016). After serving as assistant boys track and field coach at East Central in the consolidation's second year in 1979, he was named boys head coach in 1980 and remained in that position until 2016. Cotherman doubled as girls track and field head coach from 2003-16, as well.

"There have been a lot of memories over the years," he added. "But probably one of the best things was when we won our first boys track sectional championship, back in 1985. Richmond had dominated for years and it seemed like everybody else always was fighting for sec-

ond place.

"This was still when you had to qualify in each individual event just to make the sectional. Then we beat Richmond, and I think it kind of stunned them. The best thing was that we went back the next year and beat them again. I think that's what kind of took our program to the next level."

He has served as a sectional representative for the IATCCC since 1990 and is a past president and vice-president of the state coaches association.

Cotherman served as head coach and coordinator of the Indiana Men's All-Star Teams, competing in the postseason Midwest Meet of Champions, from 1998-2016.

He also has served as a member of the IATCCC's track clinic staff for many years.

LHS Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2021 bios:

JOHN BROUGHTON - A member of the Class of 1964, John was quarterback of the first undefeated Lawrenceburg High School Football team (1963) under Indiana Hall of Fame coach Pat O'Neill. He earned twelve (12) varsity letters as an LCHS athlete - 3 each in football, baseball, basketball and track and field. Head football coach and athletic director at Pendleton Heights High School for over 3 decades, he was inducted to the Indiana Football Hall of Fame in 2019. John Broughton Field, at Pendleton Heights, was dedicated in his honor that same year. Broughton passed away on May 11, 2021.

MICHELE (METZLER) DUVALL -

Lawrenceburg's first NCAA Division I volleyball scholarship athlete, Michele graduated in 2006. A 4-year letter winner in volleyball, she is the LHS career record holder in the categories of kills (1366), blocks (356), and hitting efficiency (.358). She earned All-State and Indiana South All-Star honors in 2006, and was Eastern Indiana Athletic Conference MVP that same year, having earned all-conference for both her junior and senior seasons. She went on to play collegiate volleyball at Miami (Ohio) University.

DENISE (RICHTER) KAHLEY - A 1986 graduate, Denise was an IHSAA Girls Tennis State Finalist in individual singles in both 1985 and 1986, as well as a 3-time EIAC Most Valuable Player award winner, in her sophomore, junior and senior years. The Lady Tigers' No. 1 singles player all 4 years of her high school career, she helped lead the 1986 girls tennis varsity team to the IHSAA state tournament semistate level in 1986.

RYAN KNIGGA - The Tigers' current head football coach, in his 11th year (88-33), Knigga graduated from LHS in 1996. He was a 4-year letter winner in football, a 3-year letter winner in basketball and a 3-year letter winner in baseball, earning All-EIAC honors in football his junior and senior years. A 2-way All-State selection his senior year, on both offense and defense, he represented LHS in the 1996 IFCA North-South All-Star Game. He played football collegiately at Indiana State University.

JON RICHTER - Joining sister Denise to become the first pair of siblings inducted to the LHS Athletic Hall of Fame, 1990 graduate Jon reached IHSAA Boys Tennis State Finals in individual singles in each of his 4 years in high school - with a best state finish of third in 1989. Richter earned Eastern Indiana Athletic Conference Most Valuable Player each of his 4 years, as winner of the No. 1 singles championship in the league tournament.

LHS Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2020 bios:

MATT ALBRIGHT - A gifted all-around athlete, Matt graduated from LHS in 1975, having played football, basketball and baseball for the Tigers. A one-time holder of the school record for Most Pass Interceptions in a season as a Lawrenceburg defensive back, he is probably better known as the Voice of the Tigers, as public address announcer for LHS football and basketball games for 33 years.

JIM FAEHR - A 2009 LHS graduate and multi-sport standout, Faehr earned 12 varsity letters over his 4-year high school career, 4 each in football, basketball and baseball. He earned All-EIAC honors in football twice (2007-08), in basketball twice (2008-09) and in baseball 3 times (2007-08-09). He was selected for All-State honors in Class 2A Football in 2008 and Class 2A Baseball in 2009, before graduating to play basketball at Hanover College.

RAY FURNEY - A Greencastle native and U.S. Army veteran, the personable and much-beloved Furney served Lawrenceburg as the Tigers' secret weapon, as head athletic trainer for 36 years (1978-2014), as well as a longtime LHS teacher and coach.

RON KENNETT - As 1961 LCHS graduate, Kennett excelled in basketball, baseball and track for the Tigers, earning Ron All-EIAC basketball and baseball honors twice each (1960-61). He added All-State awards in both of those sports following his senior seasons in 1961, as well. Ron went on to play basketball under National Basketball Hall of Fame coach Adolph Rupp and baseball at the University of Kentucky.

JIM PUGH - A Salem native, the innovative Pugh coached the basketball Tigers to the state's Sweet Sixteen, as regional champions late in the traditional single-class state tournament era, in 1992. He also was an offensive assistant coach on the Tigers' Class A football state champion teams, in 1975 and 1978, as well as the 1976 Class 2A state runner-up squad. The longtime LHS teacher and coach headed boys varsity basketball from 1975-95, leading the Tigers to 4 sectional titles (1981-82, 91-92). He served as an LHS football assistant from 1975-79 and 1981-94. Pugh was boys and girls varsity golf coach from 1975-83 and a girls basketball assistant coach from 1993-95.

Coaches Corner

Dewayne Uhlman - Lawrenceburg HS Boys Soccer Coach

Returning as Tigers boys varsity soccer coach for his 22nd year this fall - with 256 career wins, 11 sectional titles, 2 Final Four appearances and no losing seasons - Greendale native Uhlman retired in March after 41 years in the law enforcement field - the last 25 years, 2 months, as Greendale Police chief. He responded to Q & A just prior to the start of preseason practice:

Q: How did you get started coaching soccer?

A: It's funny, because I played football, wrestled and ran track at Lawrenceburg High School. We didn't have soccer in those days. But my guidance counselor at Purdue called me in later and said I needed one more coaching class. I'd already taken football, wrestling and track coaching classes and I had no idea what other class to take. This was about 1975-76, and he told me soccer was the fastest-growing sport in the country. I took the coaching class and enjoyed it. It reminded me so much of Gator Ball, a kind of cross between soccer and football, that (Indiana Football Hall of Fame) Coach Dick Meador had us play in summer PE at Lawrenceburg.

Q: How did you start coaching at the high school level?

A: My oldest son Garrett (now principal and head soccer coach at Irvington Prep in Indianapolis) was a junior at Lawrenceburg in 1998, and the head coach, George Hiatt Jr., needed an assistant coach at the time. He asked me to help out until they found somebody. Steve Johnson took over as head coach the following year, and he asked me to come back as assistant coach. When Steve didn't return in 2000, they asked me if I'd

like to be head coach. And the rest is history (laughs).

Q: What do you like most about coaching and the sport of soccer?

A: The best thing is the relationships you build with the boys. Jason Goepper was back in town a few weeks ago and he called and asked me to go to lunch. Just things like that. I like coaching the game, and the sportsmanship. Basically, the boys learn a lot of life lessons out there. They learn you're not going to win everything all the time. The fact is, being around 37 boys every year keeps you young, too."

Q: Now that you're retired from law enforcement, how long do you think you'll continue to coach LHS soccer?

A: As long as I'm still able to help the boys learn and improve, and it continues to be fun for me, I'll probably keep doing it. Last July, I thought for sure we were headed for our first losing season in my 21 years as head coach. We started 5 weeks late (due to COVID-19), then we lost 3-4 games in a row and had a tough month-and-a-half. Then something clicked, and we ended up knocking off a very good Batesville team to win the sectional. We finished 9-7-1, and what I thought was going to be our worst season turned out to be maybe the most fun, and most enjoyable.

Q: What has retirement been like for you so far, off the soccer pitch?

A: My wife Kathy and I have been traveling a lot. We just got back from visiting (twin son) Brock in Washington, DC. He works for the iFLY indoor skydiving experience, and we both got to do that. I drove 8 hours back from Washington and had 15 minutes to get ready to go to soccer practice (laughs). Earlier this summer, we visited (twin) Brandon (a supervisor for Pepsi-Cola) and his wife Taryn in Paducah, Ky. They've got our granddaughters, Berklee, 3, and Braylee, 2, and a little boy, Beckett, on the way in October. We also bought a camper and have been camping a lot. I did some substitute teaching at LHS this spring, and I've also helped out Tom Cheek at Leisure Pool & Spa, in Aurora, a little bit.
