## Guthrie Bike Night Finds Normalcy Amidst Pandemic

If you head to the Hoboken Coffee Roasters parking lot at around 6:00 p.m. on Thursdays, you'll be met by the sound of classic rock music playing from car speakers. You'll also be met with over a dozen colorful characters tuning up their bicycles, and even a baby doll that goes by the name of Vanessa.

Daphne Summers found

Vanessa on the side of the road during one of the group's routes a year ago. She's kind of a big deal.

"She's a mainstay," fellow rider Burk Cornelius said. "We rescued her from the side of the road."

Cornelius teased about how Vanessa has become one of the most important parts of every ride.

"There have been rides where Vanessa fell out, and we had to

turn around and go back five miles to get her," Cornelius said. "We wouldn't even do that for her (Summers)!"

Vanessa has clearly seen better days, but now she spends most of her time sitting in a basket on the front of Summers' bike. Summers bestowed the name Vanessa, but other than that, the doll is still exactly how she was the day she was found. She dons a tie-dye bandana and guides the way for the group.

"I found her and then just started riding with her," Summers said. "Really, it's kind of just about not taking this so seriously and it's supposed to be fun, right?"

Last Thursday, 17 people came to Guthrie Bike Night to go on a 17-mile trek around Guthrie. The group takes off around 6:30, but most get there early to socialize.

The group is three years old,

## Blood Donations Help Cancer Patients

Donating blood is not the most pleasant experience.

For many, getting blood drawn at a regular checkup with their doctor is something they dread.

However, it can be one of the most important things you can do to help people in need like Deborah Dean.

Dean has had one blood transfusion to treat her myelodysplastic syndrome (MDS). It affects less than 1% of the population and causes blood-forming cells in the bone marrow to become abnormal,

which leads to low numbers of one or more types of blood cells.

Treatment has been difficult due to COVID-19, but Dean considers herself lucky.

"By going to Stephenson Cancer Center, I was able to get into a clinical trial treatment," Dean said. "You know how people are scared right now, they keep hearing about clinical trials for the virus (COVID-19)? Well, you've got to have someone who's willing to do the clinical trials, so I was one, and I did the clinical trials for this drug."

The drug goes by HQ48, and Dean said her treatment with it has

been successful so far. Because she is using a new clinical trial as treatment, she is also receiving it for free.

Dean said blood donations saved her life when she had her transfusion, but she has seen people be reluctant to give recently.

"You're not helping just cancer patients, you're helping people who may have had a car accident, a motorcycle accident, you just don't know who you're helping," Dean said. "We just really want to get the word out that when there's

## State Question 805 and What You Need to Know

State Question 805 will be on the ballot for Oklahomans in November.

The measure is an attempt to reduce prison populations by limiting "extreme sentences for nonviolent crimes." The bill will also retroactively downgrade the sentences of those who are currently serving compounded prison sentences for nonviolent crimes and those who are scheduled to serve those sentences in the future.

One of the main selling points of the bill is that it will save taxpayers an estimated \$186 million of the next 10 years.

According to Yes on 805, Oklahoma taxpayers spend over \$500 million each year paying for prison overcrowding.

State Question 805 would stop Oklahoma courts from adding years to a person's prison sentence for nonviolent crimes, such as alcohol and drug related offenses, tax crimes and receipt of stolen goods or theft. People convicted of such nonviolent crimes, "Could be sentenced to the maximum allowable time in prison for their crime, but would not receive additional time in prison because of their past," According to Yes on 805. Examples cited by the movement are the sentences of a man in Oklahoma who served 33 years in prison for writing \$400 worth of bad checks, as well as a mother who stole basic necessities and toys from a Walmart who was sentenced to 15 years in prison.

Former Oklahoma Representative Kris Steele is campaigning for the bill. He

and people from all over the region travel to Guthrie to meet up and bike around the town.

Summers has been making the drive from Norman to come to the meets for a year.

"It's just a super fun group of people," Summers said. "Great roads, great people, what more could you ask for?"

The group was founded jointly by Dave Power, Josh McCulloch, Trey Woods, Travis Foote and Guthrie Tourism Director Justin Fortney. Fortney said the routes are usually between 14 and 17 miles.

"For the last couple of years, we've had one kind of main loop that we've done, but a few weeks ago, the county commissioners were fixing a bridge out there," Fortney said. "I haven't figured out whether they're

done with that yet or not."

As the winter months come along, the start times will vary based on daylight. As it gets darker earlier, the meets will leave earlier as well.

"Eventually, people won't be able to get here in time from work, so it'll fizzle out for the winter months," Fortney said. "During that time, a lot of us will get together Saturday mornings for morning and weekend rides."

The group has a Facebook page, but most updates are shared through a group chat.

"Our more widely used platform is a GroupMe chat," Fortney said. "It gets a lot of nonsense."

Fortney said anyone who wants to join does not need to have a particular kind of bicycle or setup, but that off-road bikes will serve them well. All people who want to join have to do is show up.

an opportunity to give a donation, please consider that."

Dean was reunited with her old friend Mary Coffin when they saw each other at the treatment facility. Dean taught Coffin's niece, which is how they originally met.

"She drove a fantastic, beautiful Harley (motorcycle) that I drooled over every time I saw it," Coffin said. "That's how I ended up meeting her and getting to know her a little bit."

Coffin had her first blood transfusion in March, and has had multiple since then. She was diagnosed in late February with Mantle Cell Lymphoma, which is a rare type of non-Hodgkin lymphoma. It affects her

hemoglobin levels, which results in her needing blood transfusions fairly often.

"When it happened, when I would take the chemo, my hemoglobin would drop," Coffin said. "Your hemoglobin is supposed to be between 12 and 15, and mine would go to seven. The first time it happened, I couldn't even walk into the office to get the blood, they had to pick me up at the curb with a wheelchair."

Julie Gimmel is an account consultant with the Oklahoma Blood Institute (OBI). Her main job is to organize and plan blood drives – around 20 of them each month.

She said "whole blood" is about 70% of what the OBI collects in donations. Whole blood is plasma, red cells and platelets, which

all have multiple uses to help a patient.

"Each whole blood donation could help save the lives of three patients," Gimmel said. "Often times, we'll say, 'Save a life, come out and donate,' but we should be saying, 'Come out and save three lives and donate.'"

successfully campaigned for State Questions 780, which made low-level drug possession and property crimes misdemeanors, and 781 (creating a rehabilitation fund), which passed in 2016.

"The next logical step to moving forward and right-sizing Oklahoma's prison population is to create a standard sentencing guideline for nonviolent offenses," Steele said. "Oklahoma is not only sending more people to prison per capita than any other state in the nation, people in Oklahoma are going to prison for much, much longer than they would in any other state."

General Rita Aragon, another proponent of the bill, said it will affect small towns such as Guthrie as much as it will affect major cities. Even prisons with relatively small populations are only built to house a certain amount of inmates and reducing that amount will cut costs in that

area as well.

Aragon also said current prison sentence rules can also target the mentally ill.

"I will tell you that it affects every rural community in this state, and it affects every person in this state who has a loved one who has had mental health issues and is self-medicated," Aragon said. "I'm telling you as a human being looking at other human beings and saying, 'We've really overdone this, it's just out of control,' and 805 helps resize that. It's not going to fix it all, but it will help resize that."

Oklahoma Governor Kevin Stitt has been critical of State Question 805 in interviews. Recently, he voiced concerns that the bill would reverse enhancements for human trafficking and domestic violence.

"I want to be very respectful, because I appreciate Governor Stitt and I appreciate his leadership, but I would tell you that there is some misinformation around some of the details within

the policy," Steele said. "For instance, human trafficking is a violent offense, so 805 does not even apply to that at all. There are safeguards in place, the legislature actually reclassified domestic violence as a violent crime this last session."

Steele said if State Question 805 passes, there will be new steps taken to reduce the burden on nonviolent offenders, as well as other prison policies, such as bail reform.

"We also have work to do around our bail schedules and bail practices," Steele said. "We are holding people in jail, there are people who are innocent, they haven't been found guilty of anything, that are held in jail simply because they cannot afford to pay their bond. This concept of a debtor's prison is actually not even allowed in our country's constitution. A debtor's prison is forbidden, so we have work to do around our bail practices on the front end."

The Alderson Broaddus University (W.V.) senior stayed at school over the summer and practiced daily. "I focused on juggling the ball," the Guthrie High School graduate said. "I feel that skill goes with anything."

Alderson Broaddus head women's soccer coach Jaron Hulme said she can play outside midfielder or outside back. "She's a bit more of a utility player," he said. "She always works hard. She's improved a lot. She's gotten a lot better technically. We've been pretty happy with her."

The extra time she devoted to dribbling and passing has been evident. "Her touches are a bit crisper," Hulme said. "She's reading the game a bit better and connecting passes at better times."

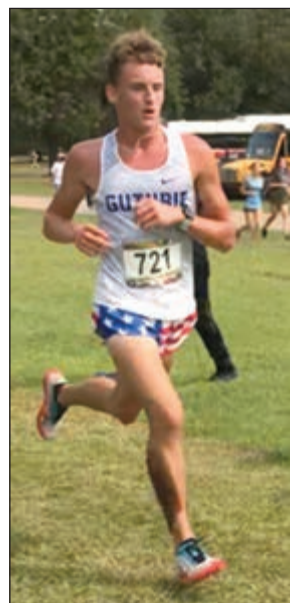
## Guthrie Cross Country Boys and Girls finish 7th and 10th
