

This year's contestants are also competing for three scholarships totaling \$6000, which will be awarded to the top three contestants.

Each contestant has the opportunity to receive a total of 200 points:

- * 50 points will depend on their fair membership sales.

- * 150 points will be based on their performance on stage.

Three independent judges will award up to 50 points on the criteria of on-stage presentation which includes stage presence, delivery of their autobiography and two interview questions.

Area prepares for 2019 Burleson County Fair

Livestock, music, Creative Living featured

The annual fair parade beginning at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21, in downtown Caldwell will kick-off the 2019 Burleson County Fair.

The fair itself will

run from Monday, Sept. 23, through Saturday, Sept. 28, at the Burleson County Fairgrounds at 905 State Highway 36 South.

Admission
Fair admission is \$10

on Wednesday and Thursday and \$15 on Friday and Saturday. There is no charge for children 8 years old and younger. Senior Citizens Day is on Thursday, when admission for seniors will be \$2.

Anyone with a current fair membership will be admitted free each night of the fair. Memberships are \$30 each, and Jessica Enrique, Paige Odenbach, Michaela Jaster and Kaitlyn Kindt are currently selling memberships for points in their competition for the 2019 Burleson County Fair Queen.

Fair memberships will be sold until Sunday, Sept. 22.

Memberships will provide free admission to the annual BCFA meeting and dinner on Nov. 7.

Parking

Parking is limited at the fairgrounds, so a shuttle bus service will run from the courthouse square on a regular basis.

Entertainment

Family entertainment is scheduled each night at the fair.

Big highlights on Wednesday night include the annual Little Miss Contest at 6 p.m., followed by the annual cake auction then the crowning of the new fair queen.

Musical entertainment on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights will include:

- * A free gospel concert at 7 p.m. on Thursday at the SPJST Hall.

- * Texas Unlimited Band from 8-11 p.m. on Thursday.

- * Crossroads Band from 8-10 p.m. on Friday.

- * Diamond Rio from 10:30 p.m. to midnight on Friday.

- * Crossroads Band from 8-10 p.m. on Saturday and again from

11:30 p.m. to 1 a.m. * Pat Green from 10-11:30 p.m. on Saturday.

Also each night of the fair, Creative Living exhibits will be open for viewing, along with craft booths and food vendors in the Expo Center.

Wagner's Carnival, LLC of Aransas Pass will present an old-fashioned carnival, with various rides and games on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.

Fair-goers may purchase a Unlimited Ride Pass each night. Wednesday and Thursday the pass will be \$20, honored from 6-10p.m. On Friday and Saturday, the pass will be \$25, with Friday's good for 6 p.m. through midnight and Saturday 4 p.m. through midnight.

Regular tickets may also be purchased.

Livestock Judging

Youth and agriculture are at the heart of this year's "Wish Upon a Star" theme, when area youth exhibit their projects in the Youth Livestock Show. Judging is scheduled on Thursday and Friday, with exhibitors competing for grand and reserve champion prizes.

Park-and-ride shuttles offered

Attending the Burleson County Fair has become easier for the public with a park-and-ride shuttle from downtown Caldwell to the fairgrounds.

Parking at the fairgrounds will be limited except to those with parking passes.

Bus shuttles will run on a regular basis, arriving a short distance from the gate, throughout the week.

Hours will be from 5:30 p.m. to midnight Wednesday through Friday and from 5:30 p.m. on Saturday until 1 a.m. on Sunday.

Guidelines and Rules

The following guidelines make access to the fairgrounds easy and safe:

- * Alcohol may not be taken onto the fairgrounds, and no one should exit the fairgrounds with alcohol.
- * No parking will be allowed on either side of State Highway 36 in front of the fairgrounds from the SPJST Hall parking area to north of the fairgrounds.
- * No parking will be allowed on either side of the road between the

fairgrounds and the SPJST Hall parking area, extending to the Burleson County Saddle Club Arena. This will allow for greater use of necessary traffic flow and will eliminate dangerous pedestrian hazards, particularly for young children.

- * A limited number of handicap parking spaces will be available in the SPJST Hall parking lot opposite the fair entrance.
- * The SPJST Hall parking lot will be reserved for the Gospel Concert on Thursday night. Directors, advisers, committee chairmen and vendors with vehicle passes may park in the SPJST lot at any time.
- * The American Legion gate is only for the use of entertainers, emergency vehicles and law enforcement on Wednesday, Sept. 26, through Saturday, Sept. 29. The Burleson County Fair Queen candidates and the queen pageant committee will be issued a one-day vehicle pass to enter and park at the American Legion Hall on Wednesday only.
